Identified preliminary sites to be acquired for the location of huts to house electronic and optronic backhaul equipment

In performing these activities Com Net incurred \$91782.26 in expenses drawing \$50,689.77 from its federal grant

During the first quarter the majority of the challenges have related to readjusted timelines based on unanticipated requirements and the timing needed to secure clarification and approval. This included the following.

Obtaining clarification to awarding agency requirements resulting in full utilization of award acceptance period prior to addressing Special Award Condition requirements

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Adjustments to project implementation plan to address Special Award Conditions specifically Environmental Assessment
Adjustments to scope of project based on fixed award period for construction give 6-month Special Award Condition period to ensure compliance with timeline requirements for substantial completion and full completion

Significant increase in time to visit with community stakeholders in managing expectations based on adjusted timelines and project scope with some delays resulting in lost or reduced commitments for use of broadband infrastructure

Adjustment of agreements with service providers, vendors and prospective network users based on adjusted timelines and clarification of requirements

In the upcoming quarter Com Net will focus efforts on completion of the following:

Equipment RFP released to obtain bids on optoelectronics in anticipation of FONSI and in compliance with SAC requirements.

Outside Plant Material RFP released and awarded for release of initial orders to establish inventory at cable yards

Completion and submission of baseline report

Continued execution of its community outreach program to keep interested parties apprised of the progress status in order to manage expectations

Submission of changes in proposed routes post drive-out and compilation of data on suitable broadband facilities available for lease or purchase

Continued participation in Ohio Middle Mile Consortium

Increased participation and collaboration with BIP/BTOP awardees in the tri-state region and nationwide

Execution of Binding Letters of Intent for acquisition of sites for equipment huts

Execution of Binding Letters of Intent for the purchase or lease of identified facilities that will be adequate for use in the network Continued review of project plans and associated agreements with our Federal Program Officer

In pursuing these activities Com Net will manage its work to realize the following key milestone dates:

Submit draft EA by 12/20/10

Issue equipment and Outside Plan RFP by 11/30/10

Insure that fiber cable will be available in needed time frame in anticipation of FONSI and in compliance with SAC. Insure that engineering and permits are substantially complete to allow construction on certain segments of the project to be initiated immediately upon notification of SAC compliance

Prepare and submit street level maps required by SAC to insure no overlap with adjacent funded projects by 12/20/10.

Prepare and submit baseline report required by SAC no later than 11/15/10

Potential delays could be lack of wage determination, equipment and OSP material lead times, unexpected delays from agencies reviewing EA and delays in issuing of permits by the Authority Having Jurisdiction. Additional challenges exist in securing final agreements with projected partners due to timeline and necessary agreement modifications along with resulting budgetary overruns for rework of plans and scope of work modifications.

In the fourth quarter of 2010 Com Net projects to expend \$478,000 to complete the projected work with a draw on its federal grant of \$334,600. Com Net is monitoring progress of its Environmental Assessment (EA), the supply and demand of outside plant fiber optic cable and the winter season construction conditions. In the event of favorable progress on the EA, a favorable winter forecast in January 2011 and/or extended lead times in the supply of Outside Plan Fiber, Com Net may spend an additional \$857,000 to inventory Outside Plan Fiber Construction Materials at its primary contractor's cable yards in western Ohio. In such case an additional \$599,900 would be drawn against the CNI federal grant in the upcoming quarter.
