During the first quarter, the award agreement, NTIA welcome packet, special award conditions and recipient handbook were reviewed with staff participating in webinars. Enrollment was completed for ASAP system, PAM and federalreporting.gov. The award was accepted. The environmental assessment preliminary process was initiated with contact to agencies and procuring professional services effective November 1, 2010 to facilitate regulatory and compliance requirements, compile required documentation and analysis, submit draft environmental assessment by January 31, 2011 and apply NTIA comments and submit Final Environmental Assessment as required with all services complying with requirements set forth in the Environmental Assessment Guidance for BTOP Award Recipients. The costs for such services shall not exceed \$9,500.

Request for qualifications for project management services were issued with four statements of qualifications received from four firms that were narrowed to two firms interviewed and ranked with the top ranked firm selected that contract negotiations now are underway to be completed by November 1, 2010 with services to begin immediately. Registration has been completed for attendance to the November 8-10, 2010 BTOP workshop. No expenditures have been made to date with expenditures to begin in November 2010 through completion of the project.

From November 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010 business and financial planning will be updated and detailed network design and engineering will occur to GIS map community anchor tenants, fiber layout for middle mile and DSL expansion, design of network, pole survey work, begin permitting application, right of way approval process, leases and completion of engineering drawings. Also, the request for proposals for design build of the co-location data center will be issued with responses to be due for consideration in January, 2011 for construction of center to begin in March/April 2011.

Procurement for network equipment, construction and management software is to occur begin February through April 2011 with twelve months of construction of network beginning in April 2011 which at the same time developing pricing and policies with service providers. In April of 2012 network installation and testing will be performed along with operations policies and procedures and procuring outside plant maintenance provider. Awareness and marketing will be ongoing throughout the project with development of website, community outreach activities and marketing materials. The entire system will be live and operational by December 31, 2012.
