By co-locating technology training, computer access, and job development services at the Public Computer Centers (PCCs), the Housing Authority of the County of San Bernardino (HACSB) has helped 256 people gain employment during the grant period to date.

8. Two subcontracts have been made to socially and economically disadvantage small businesses under the BTOP grant. The security contractor is Spigroup, and the monitoring contractor is Clayton-Morrow, Inc.

HACSB advertised the PCCs in the local community--in grocery stores, churches, and on public transportation--to raise public awareness of the available services, but also to emphasize that the PCCs are available for those who are not participants in any other HACSB program. We believe that this led to a fuller utilization of the PCCs. We also believe that co-location of computer access, technology training and job placement services at the PCCs had a positive impact on the number of people who obtained jobs.
