The PCCs are available 24-hours a day for Deaf and hard of hearing individuals to access them in order to conduct educational, legal, or commercial business. In addition, educational and instructional videos are archived to present information on how to use the equipment, how to search for, apply for, and interview for jobs. Continuing education instruction is also available live and on demand for sign language interpreters. The demand for continuing education instruction has proven very strong.

Despite the wide acceptance of the encroachment of technology into all facets of American life, there is still quite a bit of apparent distrust of the environment. While some of our clients are being compelled by court order to move into the area of accessibility via the Internet, others are very timid about making the first steps. It probably doesn't help that there are constant episodes of Internet mischief that make serious business people leery. Also, on-demand video content for instructional purposes is growing in popularity; demand has grown tremendously even since the beginning of this project. Response has been greatest when on-demand video content
