The centers provide broadband access to adolescents for schoolwork, job readiness instruction, preparation of resumes, college and financial aid search, and college and financial aid applications, thereby preparing them to enter the labor market at their full potential. The centers provide basic digital literacy to adults who are then able to use those skills as employees, as consumers and as parents who wish to promote their children's education. Digital literacy-enhanced English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) classes provide adults with the skills to participate in the labor market at their full potential and to function fully as consumers.
