#### Project Indicators (Next Quarter)

#### 1. Please describe significant project accomplishments planned for completion during the next quarter (600 words or less).

Final Report grant end 9/30/13. LCSD is proud of the project accomplishments and goals met during this final quarter of the BTOP grant. Six public computer centers are now open and continue to provide an opportunity unlike before in the rural area of Northern NV. Folks of all ages are using the computer labs for personal use, community, and educational use. The PCC's provide convenient locations for facilitators to supply computer and internet access in Advanced College level classes, Skill Training, Job Search Databases, Between those skills provided and job fairs within the PCC's, in excess of 685 residents have located Full Time Jobs found in an area that was once at 19% unemployment. These local jobs have created an annual economic impact of \$44.6 million dollars. On Monday and Wednesday evenings two PCC's host 20-30 bilingual students in ESL classes. At the PCC on the Schurz Tribal Reservation, youth are receiving Summer Youth Training, while Internet Classes, Energy Consortium meetings, and Job Skills are being provided. On Saturday mornings you can find facilitators at two of the PCC offering Senior Citizens an Introduction to Computers Class. The Video Broadcast equipment funded by the BTOP grant provides a first time experience for students to participate in Virtual Field Trips to locations such as museums, Space Camp, a bubble factory and more. They are being enjoyed by students who seldom leave their area of residency and otherwise would not visit locations such as the Cleveland Museum. Many meetings and trainings have been viewed over the Video Broadcast screens which save multiple hours of travel distance and gasoline costs with the closest city of Reno being 80 miles away. In three of the locations, Boys and Girls Clubs use the PCC's computers during their Homework Study Power Hour with their After School Programs, while in other locations, volunteer retired teachers offer tutoring time to students who drop in for extra help. During the school day, PCC's are accessed by High School students who use the Video Broadcast system to view transmitted classes from one school to another; using one teacher providing a class that otherwise would not be available to both sites. Community use for a meeting location or a training site has grown at the centers as they are open on weekends and evenings.

The success of the program was largely in part by the gift of time and effort provided by the many generous volunteers. During Q3, Lyon County School District Superintendent, Keith Savage gave each of the community PCC volunteer/facilitators a signed letter of Sincere Appreciation and a notable embossed Certificate of Recognition. Their support as Facilitators, Tutors, Class Instructors, PCC Monitors, and Hosts continues to be the nucleus of the project.

During Q3, the sustainability of the PCC's was carefully planned, meetings were held, and information was exchanged. The PCC's located in Dayton, Yerington, and Silver Springs, NV will be sustained by the Boys and Girls Club of Mason Valley, who will continue to monitor facilitators and programs to the public and students of their communities. The Walker River Indian Tribe will maintain and sustain the PCC located in Schurz, while the City of Fernley will sustain the location within the Fernley City Hall Building. Smith Valley Schools share their campus with the public library located in Smith, where a PCC is located. The Smith Valley Schools principal has agreed to monitor and sustain the PCC with the help of its Community.
