As of the end of 2011, our new PCC and existing PCC are promoting economic growth and recovery by providing educational classes as well as health and family resources. The classes include GED, ESL, Computer, and Job Skills classes. With BTOP Funding, our existing PCC was re-established in Q4 of 2011 (3.b in this report). Prior to receiving the BTOP Grant, we had computers and classes at this site, but couldn't improve or sustain the PCC due to lack of funding. Also, with public access to the Internet at these locations, both adults and teens can search, via the Internet, job opportunities in the community. Most large companies require an individual to fill out applications for employment via the Internet, prior to interviewing. We also have in place an IDA (individual development account) Program which promotes higher education, business start up, and first home purchase. With access to these and other programs in the future, individuals will have better opportunities to succeed and improve their lives.
