Our primary target has been to provide online access to those who cannot afford the service at home. Our next target has been those who need the GED and whose success will mean jobs, better jobs or other academic careers that will increase the economy with their improved salaries. We also have targeted agricultural workers, especially to identify alternative crops and methods to improve the local economy. Another important service that we have provided using the technology has been to provide community meeting space for all sorts of community building efforts from the arts to political events to educational opportunities. We have had over 10,000 people use the community meeting room space which has state of the art presentation and communication systems.
