On October 2, 2012, North Carolina Central University (NCCU) School of Law's (SOL) Domestic Violence Clinic hosted a session on "Dating Violence 101." The supervising attorney discussed how to recognize the signs of dating violence in teens and young adults and how to prevent a legacy of relationship abuse.

On October 3, 2012, NCCU SOL held an Eagle Empowerment panel discussion, "Your Voice, Your Vote." Panelists discussed the qualifications for registering and voting.

On October 9, 2012, NCCU SOL's Family Law Clinic hosted a family question and answer session for participants to ask questions related to child custody, child support and divorce to the supervising attorney in the family law clinic. This session was co-sponsored by the N.C. Fatherhood Development Advisory.

On October 15, 2012, Legal Aid of North Carolina (LANC) held a Child Custody Clinic. Participants received legal advice for their child custody cases.

On October 16, 2012, NCCU SOL's Family Law Clinic hosted a seminar on "Child Support Modification." The supervising attorney discussed what needs to be filed, who may file, when one may file and where one must file for a child support modification.

On October 22, 2012, NCCU SOL hosted a Pre-Debate Tweet-up. Student leaders from NCCU and our partner institutions participated in a pre-debate discussion prior to the final presidential debate. Participants also interacted via twitter using the hashtag #HBCUDebateChat. This event was featured on diverseeducation.com. The link to the article is http://diverseeducation.com/article/48998/.

On October 23, 2012, NCCU SOL's Domestic Violence Clinic hosted a session on "Two Sides of Domestic Violence." The supervising attorney discussed the perspectives of both the victim and the accused in domestic violence protective order proceedings.

On October 26, 2012, Jesse Jackson, Sr. visited the law school for a tour and demonstration of the telepresence room.

On October 29, 2012, NCCU SOL began a series, "Non-Profit Governance and Management: Rules, Roles and Responsibilities." In this series, Non-profit Organizational Development Consultants will discuss how to promote effective non-profit governance by understanding both public interest and legal responsibilities. The first session was called "Overview: Understanding Non-Profit Basics."

On October 30, 2012, NCCU SOL's Domestic Violence Clinic hosted a domestic violence question and answer session for participants to ask questions related to domestic violence.

On November 6, 2012, NCCU SOL's Family Law Clinic hosted a session on "Child Support Show Cause Orders." The supervising attorney discussed what to do if you find yourself with a contempt order for nonpayment and face the possibility of incarceration for nonpayment.

On November 19, 2012, LANC held a Child Custody Clinic. Participants received legal advice for their child custody cases.

On November 26, 2012, NCCU SOL held the second session in the Non-profit series. The session was called, "The Board's Role: Fiduciary Responsibilities, Fiscal Oversight and Governance.

On November 30, 2012, NCCU SOL held a panel discussion on "Where Do We Go From Here?" Panelists discussed the continuing impact and implications of race: 2012 elections and beyond.
