- 1) As described in the project's Fourth Quarter Progress Performance Report (Q4PPR), Auburn University was able to negotiate greater discounts on equipment with project vendors. This has enabled the project to expand its scope of service to include 24 additional public computing center (PCC) locations in Alabama and increase the number of computers to be distributed from 1,500 to 2,100 without adding any additional expense to what was originally budgeted. A formal Award Action Request (AAR) was submitted to the U.S. Department of Commerce during the 4th quarter to approve these changes.
- 2) When performing technology needs assessments, especially where your recipients are self-reporting, allow more time than you expect to answer questions and provide assistance. We discovered that some of our small libraries were unable to answer our very technical questions, and they needed more information from us in order to meet our data requests.
