The Neighborhood Empowerment and Support through Teamwork - Community Technology Center (NEST-CTC-BLB) Project will facilitate and support reliable broadband access to the impoverished and under-resourced community in Bayou La Batre, AL in order to support the State of Alabama's efforts to connect all Alabamians to the 21st Century information economy.

By enhancing local technological infrastructure, this project will address barriers to information and services faced by our target population, and will significantly contribute to the progress of some of the most vulnerable and underserved populations in Alabama.

With one of our partner's PCC up and running, BPSOS has begun to make exciting progress toward economic recovery and development in our area. This is being accomplished through GED and Career Development classes held at the Bayou Clinic, a local community health center.

Beginning January 1, Bayou Clinic began hosting GED classes every Tuesday and Thursday. The students participating in this program not only have access to the PCC during class, but are also free to access the PCC during regular business hours.

Bayou Clinic is also hosting a Career Development class once a month on Saturday afternoons. Local business women and at-risk youth use the PCC to develop tools and skills needed to find and maintain employment, including performing online job searches, writing resumes, interview skills, etc.
