The centers provide broadband access to adolescents for schoolwork, job readiness instruction, preparation of resumes, college and financial aid search, and college and financial aid applications, thereby preparing them to enter the labor market at their full potential. The centers provide basic digital literacy to adults who are then able to use those skills as employees, as consumers and as parents who wish to promote their children's education. Digital literacy-enhanced ESOL classes provide adults with the skills to participate in the labor market at their full potential and to function fully as consumers.

In working with a population for whom English is often not the native language and whose educational opportunities have been extremely limited, we have found that computer classes are extraordinarily challenging. The use of a keyboard, which requires a reasonably high level of literacy and comfort with the English language, is the first challenge faced by this population. Beyond that, many of those with limited formal education, while not lacking at all in intelligence and the ability to learn experientially, struggle with how to learn in a classroom setting. For this reason, we have chosen our local adult education provider to teach not only ESOL classes, but also the classes in basic Internet and computer use. This has proven highly successful in both retaining students and in helping them to gain the skills they need to function in a digital society.
