Dear Mr. Huff:

Thank you for your letter of March 15, 2010 requesting our comments on the referenced project.

We understand that Data Center will be constructed on property owned by Washington and Lee in an area traditionally utilized as a construction lay down site, debris transfer station, construction recycling transfer station, and temporary storage area for grounds materials. Based upon the documentation provided, including photographs, we agree with your assessment that no historic properties will be affected either directly or indirectly by the proposed Data Center.

With respect to installation of the fiber, we do not consider that further identification efforts are needed to establish the presence or absence of archaeological sites in the project corridor. However, care should be taken in planning both installation (and the placement of any trenches at the end of each conduit should directional drilling be required) to ensure that already identified archaeological sites are avoided. The project corridor appears to contain eight archaeological sites that have been determined eligible for the National Register of Historic Places or are considered potential eligible. We recommend avoidance of the following archaeological sites:

- 44RB0039 prehistoric; potentially eligible; reported by McLearen and Russ 1978 (map 7)
- 44RB0236 historic; potentially eligible; reported by Trout 1984 (map 12)
- 44RB0308 historic; potentially eligible; reported by McIlhany 1991 (map 12)
- 44RB0451 prehistoric; eligible; reported by Green and Griffitts 1998 (map 15)
- 44RB0462 prehistoric; eligible; no report cited on form; (map 15)
- 44RB0021 prehistoric; potentially eligible; reported by McLearen 1978 (map 6)

- 44RB0482 historic; potentially eligible; reported by Tippett 1978 (map 5)
- 44RB0510; 117-0010 historic; potentially eligible; reported by Galke and Mearns 2008 (map 5)

The Data Sharing System (DSS) inventory forms are attached to this letter as well as a series of maps showing the sites' locations. More detailed information may be available in the CRM reports in our archives. The author (s) and date of these reports is referenced in the DSS forms. It is important to keep in mind that the precise boundaries of archaeological sites are generally not determined until they are surveyed at the evaluation or Phase II level. Further, in the days before GPS systems were commonly used, archaeological sites may have been mapped somewhat inaccurately. In addition sites reported in older surveys may require an assessment of current condition to establish whether their eligibility status may have changed since they were initially reported. For this reason we strongly recommend that the project engineer work with a qualified archeologist to establish the site boundaries in relationship to the ground disturbance needed for the line. Depending on the specific site and available information, the archaeologist may need to conduct at least some limited subsurface testing to assess whether the installation will fall within the site boundaries.

In addition it is our understanding that the VDOT right of way varies considerably in width and is not available in GIS. We understand that VDOT has already been contacted about this project. If you have not already done so, we also strongly advise you to contact the archaeologist in the Salem District of VDOT, Bruce Penner at the earliest opportunity. Mr. Penner may have some more specific knowledge of these sites and their relationship to the VDOT right of way to share with you. In addition please be aware that a state permit is required for any archaeological work on state lands, including VDOT rights of way and VDOT approval of the state permit is needed. If avoidance is not possible, this will not stop the project. However, NTIA must be informed in writing. NTIA will need to be directly involved in further consultation with our office and other stakeholders as we develop a Memorandum of Agreement to resolve the project's adverse effects on specific sites. Typical mitigation for archeological sites is data recovery, a program of archeological investigations that includes an effort to make the information recovered accessible to the interested public.

We are willing to recommend to NTIA a finding of No Adverse Effect on historic properties for this project, provided that the following conditions are met:

- The Rockbridge Area Network Authority shall conduct, or cause to be conducted, a detailed archives search showing the locations of archaeological sites within or adjacent to the road rights of way.
- The Department of Historic Resources agrees to provide any available information on the sites' eligibility in terms of the National Register criteria and any available information on the sites' nature, location and extent from existing CRM reports to supplement the Data Sharing System (DSS) forms.
- The Rockbridge Area Network Authority will contact the VDOT archaeologist in the Salem District to discuss potential effects on archaeological sites within the right of way.
- The Rockbridge Area Network Authority will work with a qualified archaeologist to develop a plan to
 ensure avoidance of the identified sites.
- The Rockbridge Area Network Authority will provide the Department of Historic Resources with a
 detailed description of how the identified sites will be avoided. The description may be submitted
 electronically.
- The Department of Historic Resources agrees to respond to all requests for review within fifteen (15) calendar days of receipt.

has reviewed and approved the plan for avoidance. If no comments are received from the Department of
Historic Resources within the 15-day review period, NTIA and the Rockbridge Area Network Authority
may assume Department of Historic Resources concurs with the documentation provided and proceed.

This site consists of numerous l surface features related to an 1 extensive mining complex on l Mineral Ridge adjacent to the City l of Beuna Vista. Iron ore was mined in l this area from as early as 1890 into 1 the early 20th century. About 50 l acres of land along the north facing l slope of the ridge was surveyed for l the proposed Buena Vista Industrial l Site B. A variety of mine related 1 features were recorded along the north l face of Mineral Ridge. These included 1 large open pits, horizontal adits, l prospect holes or ventilation shafts, l mine tailings, and traces of several l roads and/or narrow guage railroad l beds. These features were recovered l during a Phase I survey within the l approximately 50 acre Buena Vista l Industrial Site B tract.
