7. Please describe how your Public Computer Center(s) promotes economic recovery in your area, such as through providing job training, access to job searches, online course offerings, certifications and the like (600 words or less).

Education is the foundation for all economic development. With a 40+% drop out rate we have concentrated on getting GED students into our center in collaboration with Mayland Community College.

To date we have offered public access to computer workstations and personal assistance for individuals using North Carolina's JobLink database and to help those being helped by the Employment Security Commission to use their site effectively. All of our staffs have been trained in the use of these resources.

We offer 1:1 help with resume writing and provide software on the workstations for that service.

We also combine access to computers with access to books, especially supporting families and family literacy. Again, early literacy is a key to academic success and digital literacy is a key for all our population to use the fabulous resources available on the internet. We have conducted focus groups related to knowledge based careers and industry, alternative agriculture programs and workshops using our presentation systems.

Be flexible. Involve lots of different groups and individuals in the planning and continued implementation process. Have a clear focus on how economic development can be inspired and encouraged by the use of the systems and development of community. The variance between the workstation deployment figures provided in the Baseline and those provided in the APR are a result of us waiting to take advantage of a combined purchase of equipment with another project. Also, during the interval between the proposal and our implementation, focus groups and advisory groups have indicated that we can serve them and the public best with different types of workstations/laptops.
