

The Idaho Commission for Libraries is pleased to be a collaborating partner with the Nez Perce Tribe in their Round 2 BTOP grant project. The Commission hopes to be awarded a Round 2 BTOP Public Computer Center grant that includes computers, user training, and programs targeting the unemployed and K-14 students for the public libraries included in the Tribe's 200 Mbps backbone project. The Commission has been coordinating their grant proposal with the Tribe to include, specifically, facilities for the libraries in Lapwai, Culdesac, Peck, and Kooskia.

The Commission's Round 2 proposed project provides computers for free public access in the libraries in the Prairie-River Library District, most of which need augmented broadband connectivity that will be made possible through the Nez Perce project. By increasing connectivity speeds and computers, the public computing centers will offer access to online education programs, basic skills tutorials, employment and job training services, and e-government resources. By purchasing new adult education and employment online services, the libraries will be able to meet an immediate need and help workforce agencies overcome the obstacles that physical distance creates for Idaho residents.

We support the Nez Perce Tribe's BTOP application to expand broadband facilities that will provide increased connectivity to the Internet for public computing centers in the Prairie-River Library District public libraries.
