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Project Indicators (This Quarter)

1. Please describe significant project accomplishments completed during this quarter (600 words or less).

Through June 30, 2012, nine (9) towers are constructed. In the wireless network, 378 radios and 314 antenna were installed. We wait for environmental approval to begin construction on the five (5) replacement towers that were noted as having structural issues. This quarter we received the balance of the microwave radios for the project. We commenced the inventory, installation, and testing of the radios to enable broadband across the entire wireless network.

Representatives of the Grant Implementation Team (GIT) continued community outreach by attending and presenting BTOP progress and opportunities at bi-monthly K12 Board of Education meetings, County Commission and Planning Council meetings. We continued to meet with representatives of the separate major community anchor institutes, briefed the Governor's Executive Office staff, and enhanced our web page presentations.

Sub-recipient Frontier Communications continues to pace ahead of their approved mitigation plan. During this quarter, we completed 126 new and 15 improved Community Anchor constructions. Six sites were previously not reported in quarter 1, two of which were new service and 4 were improved service. A total of 154 miles of fiber was completed for the quarter for a total of 399 miles complete.

We submitted to NTIA and had approved a project for "WVNET". During the quarter we ordered approximately \$3.5M of equipment for this project.

As reported by Frontier Communications, Premier Construction, WV Military Authority, The Office of Technology, and Department of Health and Human Resources, during this quarter, 131 jobs were created directly attributable to the BTOP grant.

No major challenges occurred during this guarter until late in June 2012, the entire state of West Virginia suffered from devastating winds that caused major damage and disruption of electricity, communications, and other essential services to our communities and businesses. Frontier lost valuable BTOP construction time due to the monumental efforts required to regain the state's infrastructure. This event is not expected to significantly delay the overall fiber project, The BTOP team diligently worked with the WV team during this time to provide input and general guidance.

Actual draw down flow has been hampered due to a need to provide sufficient data for State of West Virginia accounting processes. The Office of Technology worked with Frontier Communications to resolve the actual invoice presentation. The invoices now meet the overall necessary criteria with invoices currently processing through the system.

We continue to validate processes utilized for procurement of equipment early in the grant. This causes a challenge directly related to time and effort. As the Office of Inspector General (OIG), the NTIA Program Office and others meet with us and review our efforts, the team will need to redirect time and efforts. NTIA will work with us to minimize any impact to construction and/or reporting associated with such visits.

The June 2012 storm directly caused approximately one month's delay in their mitigation plan. This delay should not cause the effort to go beyond acceptable limits, but it will be a challenge to ensure compliance with deadlines and grant completion.

We requested approval to reconstruct five (5) towers that has structural deficiencies when adding the BTOP antenna. Due largely to the associated environmental efforts, we have not ordered steel or started site preparation. This presents a significant challenge to complete this initiative by grant deadlines. NTIA is working with WV to obtain the necessary approvals.

There is a potential for some funding left over after completion of the grant. This presents two challenges. First, we must develop an estimate of any remaining funds and submit our recommendation to the Governor's Office for the following: grant turn in, additional projects, etc. The second challenge is to present any proposals to NTIA, obtain necessary approval, and commence that effort.
