Construction will continue at a rapid pace as long as the weather allows. Equipment specifications and procurement activities will continue for placement next year. Community Outreach efforts keeping the stakeholders and interested parties informed will continue in preparation for agreements with potential wholesalers being signed. The District has an aggressive strategy to overcome the schedule lapses due to the EA and the challenges of materials availability and weather windows. Pend Oreille PUD has nearly completed in advance of schedule the engineering for the underground project. The District intends on letting the Underground Construction Contract this quarter with commitments to complete in Q4 2012. The contractor will be required to provide the crews and necessary workforce to facilitate an aggressive deployment schedule, but we have every confidence that this can occur. In addition, the design strategy includes placing much if not all service duct such that the fiber can be installed in winter weather conditions, specifically allowing underground work in the Q1 2013 to complete the project.
