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Project Indicators (This Quarter)

1. Please describe significant project accomplishments completed during this quarter (600 words or less).

Overall the project is 80% complete; total project expenditures are \$77M, with \$44M federal funds and \$33M match funds. The federal funds supported 124 full-time equivalent jobs during the past quarter. The local match at the end of the quarter is 43%. CMS has spent 94% of its cash match. The local match percentage will continue to decrease through the remainder of the project as those budget items marked for federal spend are incurred.

At the end of the quarter, 1,026 of 1,035 (99%) miles of new construction fiber was complete. 438 of 459 (95%) of the new fiber leases were executed. One new wireless tower was complete. Approximately 57% of the network is operational with 223 of 325 (69%) of the CAIs connected. The sub recipient, Illinois State University, completed 7 miles of approved expansion miles. CMS is continuing to work on completing four short laterals and the last few miles associated with a backbone route. After the end of the quarter, CMS received an extension through September 30, 2013.

Five additional whole sale agreements for dark fiber were executed. CMS is finalizing the Request For Proposals for the sales and marketing partner.

CMS continues to provide a monthly project update via email to community anchor institutions and interested organizations. CMS is working on completing four laterals and the last few miles of a backbone route. The four laterals include: 1) 9 miles to McHenry College of which 6 of 9 miles is complete. The remaining 3 miles are on hold until the IL Dept. of Transportation acquires easements for property associated with an ongoing road expansion project. 2) Triton College - construction will begin in July on the 4 mile route. CMS requires 2 railroad permits before the work can be completed. 3) Morton College - construction will begin in July on the 1 mile route. 4) Danville Community College - CMS has submitted a route modification request for a 2 block portion of this lateral. Construction will start in July on the approved portion of the route.

The remaining work on the backbone route is 11 miles in the City of Chicago. CMS will be pulling fiber in existing conduit for 10 of the 11 miles. The contractor will begin pulling fiber in July.

The cumulative spend estimated for next quarter is \$92M which is 95% of the total project spend. The Baseline projected a cumulative spend of \$96M or 100%. The difference between the Baseline and the PPR projection is approximately \$4M which is a result of delays early in the project starting construction, inside plant and final equipment purchases. CMS anticipates construction activities to continue through September 30 with the final \$4M in payments processed during the close out period.

CMS has received an extension through September 30 to allow time to complete the remaining 21 miles of new construction plus approved expansion routes.

CMS is working to obtain approval from seven tribes for expansion routes. Approval has been received from three of the seven tribes. We have received little to no response to the information and phone calls sent to the other four tribes. CMS has requested NTIA assistance in contacting the appropriate resources at the four tribes.
