Project Title and Project Description

Project Title: Get Connected @ Oklahoma Libraries

Project Description: The grant establishes room-and desktop-based videoconferencing capabilities, and increases broadband speeds up to 100 Mbps in 45 libraries serving 1.6 million people in 44 counties. Expanded technology in these service areas greatly improves access to distance education, e-government, and job and health information for all citizens, including low income families, minorities, youth and seniors.

Many Oklahomans face challenges finding affordable broadband service to enable access to critical online services for education, health, employment, e-government, and small businesses' needs. The BTOP program offers timely support as OK faces unprecedented fiscal constraints. The state has orchestrated a coordinated effort across agencies, community partners and the private sector to develop linked PCC and Comprehensive Community Infrastructure proposals to effectively address the state's needs.



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The CCI application, a partnership between the state, OneNet and select private service providers offers a reliable and cost-efficient network to education and government institutions across the state. OneNet, a Division of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, operates Oklahoma’s state telecommunications and information network and is currently the primary service provider for most of the libraries.

The proposed plan in this application represents the scenario where the state’s CCI application is not funded. In this instance ODL will implement the base case, and offer the best broadband connectivity and equipment that is available and affordable to 45 locations. In the alternate scenario where the state’s CCI application is approved, at least five additional locations would be served using fiber. Fiber enables greater speeds at lower costs than copper based alternatives such as T3s.

Cost savings from the additional fiber connections depends on OneNet’s updated pricing. Savings could be repurposed for workstations, community programs, or increase the match percentage.

The ODL team is aware that the CCI project’s implementation, if awarded, is uncertain. Benefits of the additional infrastructure may not be available for two or three years. For this reason, this application is conservative and has assumed no additional synergistic benefits from the CCI application. However, longer term cost reductions could contribute to this project’s sustainability.

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B. Executive Summary, Project Purpose and Benefits

Essay Question

Executive Summary of the proposed project:

Get Connected @ Oklahoma Libraries will upgrade broadband and computing resources in 45 public libraries throughout Oklahoma. Because Oklahoma is a large rural state with significant challenges across key socio-economic metrics, it is crucial to leverage broadband and implement technologies providing access to online information, distance learning and video communication.

To reduce these critical problems, \$3,353,062 is needed for the addition of 326 videoconferencing capable laptops and desktops, as well as 36 room-based videoconferencing systems. To better support existing and new computers and to support high quality videoconferencing, the project would upgrade the broadband connections at 42 locations and to provide Internet at a minimum speed of 1 Mbps.

Oklahoma is among the lowest ranked states in many core areas that are addressed by elements of the proposed project:

- In the US Census (2007), Oklahoma is ranked the 10th poorest state in the nation and the 41st in percentage of population with a bachelor’s degree or higher
- In a report by the Kauffman Foundation (2008), Oklahoma is ranked 45th in percentage of population that is online, 40th in Health IT, 39th in e-Government , and 43rd in high tech jobs and 39th in knowledge based jobs

To most efficiently address these challenges and critical BTOP objectives, ODL carefully selected the main library branches in the neediest 44 of 77 Oklahoma counties (serving 1.58M Oklahomans – 45% of the population). Of these 44 selected counties with the largest concentrations of vulnerable people:

- 100% have higher than national average % of Native Americans



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- 98% have an estimated broadband penetration lower than the NTIA benchmark of 40% (qualifying as underserved)
- 77% have literacy rates lower than the national average
- 75% have median incomes below the national poverty level
- 73% meet at least one of the two criteria for economically distressed as defined by the NTIA
- 71% have higher than national average % of senior citizens

Recognizing the depth and breadth of the need in these counties, the project proposes an ambitious but achievable plan to combine the power of upgraded technology and targeted community programs focusing on four main pillars:

1. Education:

Encourage and actively market distance learning opportunities through videoconferencing to empower Oklahomans in rural areas to participate in online education available anywhere in the state or the world. Offer computer literacy courses to enable people to realize the many benefits and encourage adoption of computers and broadband at home. Educational opportunities via videoconferencing/webcast for distance learning will include:

- Online college courses (taught by instructors from community, state, or national colleges)
- Courses in continuing education/ professional certification.
- Expanded/enhanced curriculum for K-12

2. Poverty Alleviation:

“We have people coming in every day who ask for help in filling out online job applications. Our largest local employers all require online applications, many of which also have tests or assessments of some kind along with the application. These people are at a serious disadvantage because they are not experienced on the computer, even if the job they are applying for will require no computer use whatsoever.” (Public Library of Enid and Garfield, Letter of Support)

The local libraries will actively use videoconferencing equipment to provide job skills training, enable online interviews, and allow small businesses to communicate globally with users and partners. Some libraries will offer netbooks for check-out from the library premises to allow completion of resumes and cover letters. Specific workforce development opportunities will include:

- Job skills training and workshops with national employers through videoconferencing



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- Access to basic communication tools such as email, virtual phone numbers, and voicemail services (e.g. Google Voice) so that even the poorest can be reachable by prospective employers

3. Health

Encourage videoconferencing for patients to attend tele-therapy/consultations with national specialists and enable healthcare workers to attend training. Specific health related opportunities will include:

- Teletherapy sessions for the disabled (e.g. Hearts for Hearing)
- Teleconsultation between generalist in Oklahoma and specialist elsewhere in the country

4. eGovernment

Encourage the use of tax software and offer online and in-person training on filing taxes online and filling-out other online government forms.

We conservatively estimate that the computing centers will serve an additional 8,538 persons per week (~20% increase on the 42,693 persons currently served per week). This increase will be driven by added computers, improved connectivity, new videoconferencing capabilities, additional use of Wi-Fi after hours in parking lots, and also by significant increase in community outreach using both traditional and modern means.

As a result of the proposed project, a number of direct and indirect jobs will be created and/or saved:

- 3 Direct jobs-years will be created for 3 years of a program manager, a grant administrator, and a training coordinator working part time on the project
- 13 Indirect jobs years will be created by spending on outsourced IT services, facilities renovation, computer hardware, broadband connection installation and monthly recurring charges, networking equipment, graphic design, and printing services
- Additional 9 induced job-years will be created as a result of direct and in-direct job creation inside and outside OK
- ODL plans to partner with local businesses for outreach and IT support
- ODL also expects that the newly available workforce development resources will enable hundreds of additional job applications

The overall project cost is \$3,353,062. Of that, \$2,333,250 (69.6%) would come from BTOP funds and the remaining \$1,019,812 (30.4%) will be matching funds in cash.



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The Oklahoma Department of Libraries has extensive experience in administering grants, and coordinating statewide projects. ODL has successfully administered E-Rate funds from the FCC since 1997 and today Oklahoma has a 96% participation rate (one of the highest in the nation) with an average discount of 80%. The ODL has also been administering Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) funds since 2000 ranging from \$1.8M to \$2.3M per year. Finally, ODL has also successfully administered private grants totalling over \$800K from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

The team is well versed in grant administration using processes and administrative systems that have withstood repeated audit scrutiny. In recognition of the substantial implementation and management burden, the project budget reinforces the team with a dedicated grant administrator, supplemental IT support, and support for training participating libraries to apply for E-rate in order to build their capacity to sustain the project following the conclusion of the BTOP project period.

The proposed project will directly impact millions of citizens across the state and address fundamental issues that will transform OK from a state that lags behind its peers to a positive and inspiring example for others.

Project purpose:



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OK's high poverty, low educational achievement, and high mortality in conjunction with long distances between cities, and small, rural populations are problems compounded by broadband underservice and low adoption levels.

OK's 16% poverty rate, higher than the natl. avg. of 13% was substantiated in 2009 when OK was identified as the eighth worst state by hunger rates and food hardship and as the tenth highest number of people below the poverty line. Most OK counties (59 of 77) meet at least one or more criteria in the NOFA's definition of economic distress.

The US Census ranks OK 41st in terms of percentage of population with a bachelor's degree or higher. Only 22% of Oklahomans over the age of 25 have a bachelor's degree vs. the natl. avg. of 27%. A Pew study (2009) links educational attainment to broadband penetration (30% penetration rate for those with less than a high school diploma as compared with 83% for those with a bachelor's degree).

A 2008 report (OK State Dept of Health) ranked OK consistently near the bottom on health metrics, receiving an "F" for mortality rates from diseases such as heart disease, cancer, diabetes, and influenza. Long distances between homes and hospitals are a key contributing factor which nearby libraries offering online health services could mitigate. Helping people maintain and monitor their health becomes increasingly important as health costs continue to increase and OK's population continues to age.

Estimated 2009 US consumer broadband penetration was 64% (IDC) versus OK's 51% (CSMG). In a Kauffman Foundation report (2008), OK ranked 45th in percentage of population online. According to NTIA's study, home broadband use was highest (89%) among the most affluent incomes(>\$150,000) and lowest (29%) among low incomes(<\$15,000). Libraries, which provide free service, play an important role in bridging this divide.

The project focuses service enhancements on OK's core problems: education, jobs, poverty alleviation, health, and eGovernment. Enhancements include increased broadband speeds, four computer labs, 36 videoconferencing centers, and 326 videoconferencing capable workstations will be implemented in 45 libraries.

A metrics-driven approach (see uploads for graphical representation) was used to select libraries with priority given to counties that maximize reach and impact:



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- Higher than avg. percentage of vulnerable populations and high poverty rates
- Broadband penetration lower than NTIA’s underserved benchmark of 40%
- Greater cost-effectiveness
- Demonstrated interest, commitment, and ability support the project beyond the grant period

The resulting target libraries’ estimated service population is 1.6M (45% of the state population) in 44 of OK’s 77 counties.

- 100% have higher than natl. avg. Native Americans
- 98% have estimated broadband penetrations lower than the NTIA benchmark of 40%
- 77% have literacy rates lower than the natl. avg.
- 75% have median incomes below the natl. poverty level
- 73% meet at least one of the two criteria for economically distressed as defined by the NTIA

Education

“We are in such an isolated area, videoconferencing is critical for our citizens. ...saves us 400 mile round trips to Oklahoma City and other urban areas...and provides us educational opportunities that would not be available otherwise.” (Adj. professor, OK Panhandle St. University)

Distance learning opportunities will include:

- Online college courses (taught by instructors from community, state, or national colleges)
- Courses in continuing education/ prof. certification
- Expanded/enhanced curriculum for K-12 (e.g., additional language options, greater selection of advanced placement courses, enhanced math and science education, and addl. Govt. educational resources such as NASA video streams)

Jobs and Poverty Alleviation

Job Search: Library workstations provide job seekers access to basic communication tools such as email, virtual phone numbers, and voicemail services (e.g. Google Voice) so that even the poorest can be reachable by prospective employers.

Job Training: Public libraries that offer videoconferencing will actively encourage citizens to attend online video-based job training to develop skills for the increasingly competitive job market.

Small Business Development: Leverage videoconferencing to enable temporary tele-working and stimulate and support small businesses and entrepreneurs.



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Software Subscriptions: Complement traditional job search resources, by purchasing software licenses in selected libraries for tutoring, standardized test prep, and career counseling.
- Tutor/Learning Express/Brainfuse (examples)

Health

“This project is a perfect match for the work we do at Hearts for Hearing of teaching children touched by hearing loss to listen and talk.” (Hearts for Hearing)
Tele-Medicine: Videoconferencing will enable tele-consultation for diagnoses, patient education, mental health evaluation, and counseling. ODL has developed a partnership with Hearts for Hearing to offer tele-therapy sessions for children who are hearing impaired. Videoconferencing will also be used to stream videos from national health organizations such as the NIH and CDC.
Online Certification: Libraries with videoconferencing will enable healthcare workers to complete training that may otherwise not be available. ODL has partnered with organizations such as Hearts for Hearing, Mental Health Institute, etc. to offer remote online certification courses in the library.

eGovernment

Software: The state will invest in TurboTax to enable online filing. ODL will also leverage the state’s investment in EarnBenefit software which automates matching vulnerable individuals with services related to unemployment, housing assistance, food aid, etc.

This project will directly address fundamental issues that will transform OK from a state that lags behind to an inspiring example for others.

Recovery Act and Other Governmental Collaboration:

OK received a Round 1 BTOP Recovery Act grant, State Broadband Data and Development Grant Program, totaling \$5,241,907 to provide mapping of fiber routes present in OK. The State’s match of \$4,105,330, will provide a combined total of \$9,347,237. All fiber routes in the state will be mapped, thereby identifying underserved areas needing service. In addition, a CCI application will be submitted by the State in Round 2 which proposes to extend fiber to anchor institutions. These two projects relate directly to this PCC application. The mapping will identify where current fiber exists and the CCI project, if funded, will extend fiber to unserved and underserved areas of the state. As fiber is available in more places, more libraries will have ethernet services available, which are substantially less expensive than T3’s. Therefore, more



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libraries will be able to afford faster broadband and users will have access to enhanced Internet services.

The ODL receives a Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) grant annually from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). \$22,770,353 has been received from 2000-2010. The Act was “designed to assist in remedying a serious deficiency in the educational program of the United States.”

The purposes and priorities of the LSTA coincide with the PCC objectives. In 1996 Congress approved the Museum and Library Services Act and recognized the desirability of using new technologies “in promoting access to learning and information resources in all types of libraries for individuals of all ages. 20 U.S.C.” In 2003 this act was expanded to promote improvement in library services, facilitate access to library resources and to encourage resource sharing “in all types of libraries for the specific purpose of better serving the people of the United States, cultivating an educated and informed citizenry and achieving economical and efficient delivery of library services to the public.”

The ODL FFY2010 award will augment the PCC project by allocating up to \$300,000 to purchase licenses for software such as Tutor.com or Brainfuse for use by participating libraries' users.

Each of these projects ultimately address the objective of improving the lives, skills and education of Oklahoma citizens. Increased broadband speeds and videoconferencing are only some of the methods employed to accomplish these goals. By combining efforts, objectives can become a reality and money is most effectively and efficiently utilized.

Technology Strategy:

ODL’s technology strategy will ensure that targeted libraries have robust throughput and computing resources that enable a range of services. ODL will manage implementation risk by leveraging existing service providers for connectivity and by purchasing proven LAN and computing equipment. A proven IT systems integrator will be contracted to support broadband and workstation implementation and maintenance at the upgraded library locations.

Direct Internet Access



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The ODL's objective is to provide busy hour download speeds of 1Mbps per workstation at libraries receiving connectivity upgrades. This standard will support the use of HD videoconferencing and streaming video at all workstations. Fiber-based Ethernet Internet access used whenever possible "future proofs" connections because they can be more easily upgraded as bandwidth needs increase.

To leverage federal and state middle-mile investments and minimize costs, ODL is coordinating closely with OneNet (Oklahoma's statewide education network). For each library included the ODL team gathered information on broadband availability and cost from OneNet and the major for-profit service providers. The plan assumes that OneNet fiber connections will be used for most locations but final service providers will be selected through a competitive process. In locations that cannot be economically serviced with fiber, ODL selected the next most cost effective access approach that meets its bandwidth requirements. Assumed connection types selected include: T3, fractional T3, and multiple T1. The most efficient combination of public and private infrastructure will be leveraged to provide high quality access for each workstation.

LAN Infrastructure and CPE Components

Library networking solutions were designed by technical consultants, and vendor experts from Cisco and OneNet. Locations upgrading connectivity will receive new routers, switches, and firewalls. LAN components will be selected to provide reliable, secure connections and to maximize the impact of government funding. A detailed survey has been conducted of existing library technology infrastructures for each location's specific equipment requirements.

Routers selected would ease implementation and provide a consistent and robust feature set for each circuit type:

Fiber-based Ethernet: Cisco 2911 Integrated Services Router (\$1,972)

T3 and Fractional T3: Cisco 3945 Integrated Services Router plus T3 network module (\$15,073)

Multiple T1: Cisco 2811 Integrated Services Router plus 3 WAN interface cards (\$4,486)

These routers are:

- Capable of handling 1Gbps D/L and U/L (no bottlenecks if future connectivity needs increase)
- Remotely manageable (can be cost effectively monitored and managed by service provider and/or centralized library IT staff)
- Currently in use to connect numerous anchor institutions to the OneNet network



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- Offer robust Internet routing tables and support for secure VPN and QoS to enable real-time services

Routers will be connected to dedicated firewalls (\$609) wherever required to securely and reliably handle the increased throughput without creating a bottleneck. Filtering equipment will also be supplemented wherever required to ensure E-Rate eligibility.

A combination of existing and new switches (\$339-\$663 per location) will distribute the bandwidth to provide reliable, high speed access to new workstations, existing workstations, and customer laptops.

Public Access Workstations and Other Equipment

ODL will purchase high-end laptop and desktop computers sufficient to handle current and foreseeable usage requirements. \$1,200 per desktop bundle and \$1,300 for a laptop bundle (inclusive of tax and shipping) has been budgeted.

Competitive bidding and state contract pricing will ensure that ODL gets the best value for funds allocated to purchase workstations. A robust feature-set is available at the assumed costs (2.33GHz Core 2 Duo processor, 8 GB of RAM, 750 GB of hard drive storage, Windows 7). We anticipate that actual specifications at implementation will be better yet due to:

- Aggressive discounting by vendors (through competitive bidding and potential bulk discounts)
- Consistent price deflation/ component improvements in personal computing

ODL has also budgeted funds for 36 room-based and 326 desktop videoconferencing systems. Room-based systems will support larger group interactions at full 1080p resolution on 42” screens. Desktop systems will offer 720p supporting one-on-one conferences and interoperation with room-based systems.

Both configurations will leverage a dedicated “blade” that the ODL will purchase with program funds. The blade will allow up to 40 locations to participate in each conference. Larger, scheduled sessions can overflow onto service provider systems. The room-based videoconferencing system entails recurring costs of \$100,000 per year. ODL has committed to supporting these annual costs after the conclusion of the project.

Software for Education, E-Government, and Workforce Development



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ODL plans to use state and LSTA funds to invest in software resources. This software will be available at all libraries participating in the grant.

Outsourced IT Support/Management

ODL has allocated \$180,000 (plus \$40,000 in dispatch travel fees) over a three year period for a vendor to:

- Interface with service providers to ensure successful connectivity upgrades
- Implement LAN and computing upgrades at each target library
- Manage, monitor, and maintain connectivity and computing resources
- Track and manage resolution of trouble tickets
- Train local library staff in broadband connection maintenance, ensuring sustainability beyond the three-year contract

The firm will be selected through a competitive bidding process in full compliance with BTOP and state rules. Preference will be given to minority owned and small businesses.

Public Availability:

The public library is free and available to all members of the public. Desktop/laptop webcam conferencing is available during regular library hours. In designated libraries, netbooks will be offered for check out.

Videoconferencing facilities can be accessed during and after library hours. Staff will schedule classes, individuals, community groups and businesses upon request.

Facilities will be scheduled on a first come, first serve basis. This is in line with current availability guidelines.

Restrictions on Center Use:

Usage of workstations within the library will be restricted by the hours of operation of the facility.

However, many locations offer Wi-Fi which can be accessed in the parking lot after business hours. This feature has been used, for example, by a local mayor sitting in his pickup truck



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working on his laptop and by Oklahoma Storm Chasers who follow tornadoes using parking lot Wi-Fi access to report back to local television stations. 93% (63 of 68) of libraries responding to an ODL survey reported that their Wi-Fi is accessed after hours.

Some locations will allow check-out of netbooks which will allow users to take the netbooks home to complete job applications, government forms, homework assignments, and other tasks that need more time than the allotted time limit per workstation.

Involvement of Community College:

Professors from community colleges will be actively recruited to volunteer their time to present short courses at library videoconference centers. Classes will be offered free and can be attended by users at the local library or by videoconference from library videoconference centers throughout the state.

PCCs will be located in libraries and students will be encouraged to use videoconferencing facilities for distance learning to attend courses from community, state, and national colleges.

The Executive Director of the OK Association of Community Colleges expressed support: "Increased funding for public computer centers at Oklahoma's Libraries will enhance Oklahoma's community colleges... allow local libraries to expand videoconferencing to current and prospective community college students; facilitate online class instruction from remote, and underserved locations in rural Oklahoma."

Western OK State College offers: "Western Oklahoma State College (WOSC) administration and staff will work closely with the Southern Prairie Library System in any training and technical support in helping train and counsel in this project. WOSC has years of experience in the delivery of distance education and training and will be happy to share in various aspects of implementation of the Public Computer Center at the Southern Prairie."

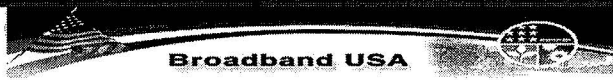

Description of the involvement of the partners listed above in the project.

ODL has partnered with organizations and stakeholders to ensure maximum usage of the PCC, desktop and laptop videoconferencing facilities. Librarians' usage statistics, observations, comments and suggestions for improvement, obtained from two surveys drove the specifics of the project. Librarians' knowledge of their communities led to involvement of local groups and partnerships.

Library Partners: Forty-five public libraries, identified by demographic and economic profiles, were selected as partners. Libraries and their funding entities have signed letters of commitment and have pledged that the non E-Rate portion of the monthly Internet costs will be covered at termination of grant.

Libraries have received enthusiastic responses for the improved broadband access and the opportunity to offer high-end room and desktop-based videoconferencing. Libraries have garnered 200+ support letters from their respective communities. Judging by the number, caliber, and diversity of support letters secured, it is evident that they have a positive, workable approach to involve their local communities. ODL will provide marketing for the project on a statewide level as the librarians continue locally.

Libraries will receive equipment allowing access to higher speed broadband, desktop/laptop and room-based videoconferencing capabilities. Staff will schedule videoconferencing equipment



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and offer programs. ODL will hire a technical trainer to train librarians on use of the equipment and all room-based videoconferencing equipment will be managed centrally.

Library Friends Groups: Library Friends groups, major supporters of public libraries through financial aid as well as volunteer assistance, have pledged their continued commitment to technology enhancements in their libraries. Local groups host fund raising events such as chocolate festivals, book sales, golf tournaments, etc. They will be important in sustaining the services provided by the grant.

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF): Oklahoma was one of only 14 states selected through a competitive process to receive a grant through The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, the world's largest philanthropic organization and long-time supporter of public libraries. They generously committed \$750,000 as a cash match contingent upon BTOP grant approval; an additional \$126,480 to support training cost associated with building capacity of libraries to sustain their projects following the BTOP period. In addition, BMGF hired CSMG, a telecommunications consulting firm, to support the grant writing process for \$119,155.

State CCI Application Working Team: A collaborative relationship has been established with the team submitting the State's Middle Mile CCI application. The team consists of representatives from the Department of Transportation, State CIO, OneNet (the state network), local telecoms, and the president of the Native American Broadband Association. In the event that the State's plan is approved, ODL would be able to offer faster bandwidth in more locations. As fiber is available in more locations, additional libraries may be able to upgrade speed. The original 45 sites addressed in this grant could be used as a pilot project to enable other libraries to replicate their success.

The National Network of Libraries of Medicine, South Central Region: Instructors will continue to offer classes in the ODL computer lab and will utilize videoconferencing to reach a wider audience.

African Americans: Associations and businesses from the African American community have pledged to advertise and promote library services to members and employees. Their goals are to improve the lives of African Americans by emphasizing education, job skills and health services available through the library.



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Businesses: Hispanic businesses pledged to advertise and promote library services to members of their communities. Business owners indicated a desire to use videoconferencing services to obtain additional education required for their jobs, contact customers living in other countries and attend conferences without travel expenses.

LinkTV Television Without Borders: Located through match.Broadbandusa.gov website, this organization offers a global perspective on world issues and cultures. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation funded the development of a new user interface with multimedia search functions allowing customers to acquire “work skills training and to better understand the jobs marketplace.” Oklahomans without DIRECTV or Dish Network would not have access to these educational and diverse cultural programs without computers and high speed broadband at their local library.

Native American Tribes: Partnership between Native American tribes and local libraries will encompass distance learning and telemedicine which may not be available locally. Tribal leaders will disseminate information and promote use of the resources. Approximately two-thirds of Oklahoma’s land area is within tribal jurisdictions with 37 federally recognized tribes representing a population of over 275,000.

Workforce Oklahoma: Partnership formed with Department of Commerce “We pledge our support and services to this project and the Oklahoma Department of Libraries as it will enhance education opportunities by allowing accessibility to online classes and continuing education, alleviate poverty by assisting with job searching and work skills training, and give citizens of Oklahoma greater access to online services and meetings.”

Vulnerable Populations

Oklahoma is a diverse state with large numbers of vulnerable populations, many of whom lack affordable access to broadband Internet. The proposed application will take a number of direct steps to serve vulnerable populations:

Hispanic: Outreach to one of the fastest growing segments of OK's population will be accomplished through advertisements in Spanish newspapers, radio and TV. As with previous programs, a Spanish translator will be hired. Librarians will work closely with key partners. (See Letters of Support)

Native American: OK has one of the largest Native American populations (275K) nationally with 37 federally recognized tribes. 21 of those tribes are headquartered in areas served by the selected libraries. "Language revival" of declining Native American languages through software and local volunteers will be one of the programs to revive endangered languages such as Cherokee. To attract participation, the marketing plan will include outreach at Native American events. Targeted actions and programs will be developed in close partnership with organizations such as the Cherokee Heritage Center and tribes identified in Partnership section.

English as a Second Language: For OK's large Hispanic population of almost 200K, ODL will purchase Rosetta Stone software to assist Spanish and other non-native English speakers. These programs will be enhanced with new equipment, software and connectivity. To attract the ESL population, outreach campaigns will be bilingual in targeted areas.

Disabled: Please refer to "Accessibility" section for details on actions to welcome people with disabilities.

Low Income and Unemployed: To address OK's poverty challenges, among the most severe in the country, libraries will offer a number of basic skills, computer education, job search and training programs. Job training software such as Learning Express will also be available. All



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targeted outreach and programs will be developed in close partnership with the Department of Commerce (see Letter of Support).

Senior Citizens: Lack of training, unfamiliarity with Internet and computers are consistently rated as top reasons for low broadband adoption among senior citizens. To make the Internet more user friendly for senior citizens, a number of how-to classes will be held for senior citizens which will include setting up email accounts, typing, and browsing the web.

Youth: Hearts for Hearing and community colleges partners will target youth via teletherapy and online courses respectively. In addition, social networking and other popular applications will be used to attract the younger population to the libraries.

Accessibility

The proposed project encourages persons with disabilities to use the available facilities. ODL will encourage use by the disabled community by adding teletherapy and accessibility software.

Teletherapy Sessions: ODL has formed a partnership with Hearts for Hearing, a non profit that specializes in providing comprehensive hearing healthcare for children. They serve over 2100 children with hearing difficulties. Fewer than 20% of these children were seen in 2009 at their headquarters in Oklahoma. The remaining children are located across the state where there are no pediatric hearing health care services or therapists. The videoconferencing equipment that the ODL is planning to provide across the state will enable these children to participate in teletherapy sessions. Teletherapy has been piloted by the Hearts of Hearing for a few families but lack of broadband in rural areas either due to availability or affordability have limited a more widespread adoption.

In the words of Joanna Smith, Executive Co-Director of Hearts for Hearing, “many of our families are unable to afford computers in their homes and the availability of broadband technology through the library system would allow for less travel time, more consistent therapy and likely better listening and spoken languages.” Videoconferencing would allow for an additional 1500 children with poor hearing abilities to attend therapy sessions. For more details into the described problem and impact of teletherapy, please refer to Letter of Support and service area map from Hearts for Hearing in the Uploads Section.



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Disability Software: Microsoft Windows 7, which has been selected for all new workstations has robust accessibility features such as speech recognition, on-screen magnifier, narrator, and visual notifications. Since many existing public access computers currently in use run older versions of Windows with fewer accessibility features, we expect the new workstations to be a meaningful accessibility improvement for people with disabilities.

Existing ADA Compliance: The proposed project aims to expand computer and broadband resources available at public libraries, most of which are facilities that are already compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Handicapped-accessible features common to all public libraries include ADA-compliant entrance ramps, bathrooms, and book stack layouts (wide enough spacing for a wheelchair to pass through).

Finally, some libraries have an existing dedicated workstation reserved for people with disabilities. Libraries will not purchase any additional accessibility equipment or software specifically for disabled individuals.

OK public libraries are accessible and staff are welcoming for all citizens. Given the above direct approaches, the proposed project will be accessible to persons with disabilities.

Other Languages

Languages are a key component of the project to maximize the reach and impact of the BTOP funds. Direct efforts will be taken for Oklahomans for whom English is their second language so they may take advantage of the upgraded equipment and connectivity.

Training: In areas with large Hispanic populations, trainers will teach classes in both English and Spanish. Trainers will be hired based on their ability to speak both languages. Training programs conducted across the state in Spanish have previously been successful. Rosetta Stone software will be available in English and Spanish.

Outreach: Targeted outreach including radio ads, newspaper press releases, and brochures will be used to attract Spanish speaking populations. All outreach will be done in English and Spanish. Information will be distributed to the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, Hispanic businesses and other Hispanic professional organizations. Key partners have been identified. (See Support Letters)

Public Computing Centers Outreach

Overview:

ODL is pursuing technology upgrades that will benefit Oklahomans of all ages, ethnic backgrounds, and income levels. The outreach plan will use both paid and unpaid elements. Targeted advertising and publicity events will be used to reach large groups of new and existing library users. At the county level, local media and community partner relationships will be leveraged in order to publicize the technology upgrades.

An outreach plan has been created to allow local libraries to customize their publicity efforts to the needs of local populations. Locally-focused efforts will allow libraries to take advantage of existing relationships with local media and partnerships with community institutions.

Outreach efforts will be driven by local libraries, under the guidance of ODL and a local marketing firm. A graphic design firm will be contracted to create a program logo and templates for posters, brochures, and flyers.

Outreach Targets:

Publicity efforts will be targeted to all possible users of the new library connectivity and videoconferencing services, with targeted focus on vulnerable populations with needs across the four project target areas.

Partnerships:

Friends of Libraries (FOL) groups will be key strategic partners in community outreach. These groups have historically supported libraries both financially and through library programming and publicity efforts. FOL groups affiliated with the Tahlequah, Fairview, Shawnee, Purcell, and Cherokee libraries and the Chickasaw Regional Library System have committed their support for the project.

Specific Plans:

- Education: K-12 schools and community colleges will receive publicity materials highlighting services available to students and encouraging the use of videoconferencing for distance learning opportunities



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- Jobs & Poverty Elimination: Brochures and posters will be placed at local unemployment and financial assistance/welfare offices. Access to online job resources, word processing services, and software resources will be highlighted. Social workers will also be encouraged to direct benefits recipients to online resources
- Health: Brochures will be sent to local doctors and hospitals encouraging health professionals to have their patients use online medical resources and videoconferencing for telemedicine appointments. Information will also be distributed through the Turning Point partnership to alert community coalitions
- eGovernment: ODL will create brochures and flyers explaining the benefits of filing taxes and other government forms online
- Advertising: Highway billboards will be rented near major intersections. Funds have been budgeted for publicity spending at statewide events, such as tables and sponsorships at rodeos or state fairs

We estimate that the outreach campaign and the expansion of available services will generate at least 8,538 additional users per week (20% increase).

Sturdy, high-end equipment will be purchased in order to provide the best possible user experience and maximize the machines' useful lives.

All new laptop and netbook computers will have 802.11n Wi-Fi capability. State-of-the-art wireless network routers will be installed in each location receiving upgraded connectivity.

Room Videoconferencing: A standard system consisting of a 42" LCD monitor, 1080p HD video camera, and room microphones will be purchased for selected libraries, based on available facilities and connection speed.

Desktop Videoconferencing: High-def webcams and headsets will be purchased for each new laptop and desktop. Webcams and headsets will allow users to participate in one-on-one and group video and audio conferences. Headsets will allow users to access streaming audio and video resources without disrupting other users.

Projectors and Printers: Some literacy centers, located within public libraries, have been allocated these items as part of the grant request. Projectors will allow groups of ESL students or illiterate adults to follow on-screen lessons. Printers have been requested in order to create student worksheets and take-home materials.

Workstation software

Microsoft Office software will be purchased for each new workstation using BTOP funds. MS Word and Excel will allow students to complete homework assignments. Adobe Acrobat software licenses will be purchased to enable job seekers to fill-in, save, and submit online forms. Job seekers will also be able to create resumes and develop their proficiency with common business applications.

Videoconferencing workstations will be equipped with desktop client software purchased from the vendor selected for room-based videoconferencing. This client will allow individual workstations to interoperate with room-based systems, participate in multi-user sessions, and view archived sessions.



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Free programs such as Skype will also be made available to allow users to have one-on-one audio and video chats with friends and family worldwide.

Web browsers will enable users to access job and government resources. Most employers, including many national retail and restaurant chains, require job applications to be submitted online. Online job search databases will also be accessible to users. Users will also be able to use browsers to apply for govt benefits and register for programs such as Selective Service and Social Security.

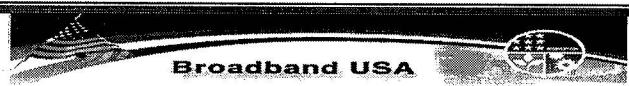
Training and education programs

Training and education under the PCC project will come in multiple forms. A training plan has been created to ensure the sustainability of the BTOP technical upgrades and to maximize the benefits of the proposed technology upgrades for end users. The Training Coordinator budgeted as part of the BTOP program will be responsible for scheduling and evaluating the training programs.

Technical Training: Will be led by the Training Coordinator in partnership with the contracted IT systems integrator and local librarians. The Training Coordinator will visit local libraries around OK in coordination with the systems integrator to prepare local staff to monitor and maintain new broadband connections, computers, and videoconferencing systems. This process will help ensure that system configurations and processes are consistent across OK while also allowing for customization to address the varied needs of the counties receiving upgrades. Local librarians and their local IT support team/volunteers will be trained in ongoing maintenance.

Videoconferencing: Following introductory training from the statewide room-based videoconferencing vendor, local librarians will be prepared to instruct patrons on the use of room- and desktop-based videoconferencing resources.

Successful implementation of room-based videoconferencing statewide will allow for expanded training and educational opportunities. Local librarians will participate in statewide software

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instruction. Community groups will also be able to use videoconferencing and high speed connections to access education and certification resources.

Thomas J. Harrison Pryor Pub. Lib. is interested in using videoconferencing to lead classes for other libraries: “If our library staff offers any type of instructional class, participating libraries could utilize the conferencing equipment to allow their patrons access to that class. Libraries would be able to collaborate on instructional program schedules thus saving staff preparation time, providing higher quality programs due to individual expertise, providing a greater quantity/variety of programs, and even sharing of other technologies via videoconferencing. This could yield a better educational experience and address more patrons’ needs, because it is difficult on limited budget and staffing to dedicate time and resources to the production of a program which may only benefit a few people.”

Librarian to Customer: Over the course of the three year project, the Training Coordinator will organize statewide librarian training sessions. Past training projects have demonstrated the ODL’s ability to create training content that can be taught to local librarians and passed on to users.

In the past, the ODL has hosted librarians at its computer facilities in Oklahoma City in order to conduct training. Videoconferencing would allow broader librarian participation in training sessions. Past subjects of ODL librarian training sessions have included Microsoft Word and PowerPoint, Photoshop, Excel Databases, blogging, Twitter, and digital scrapbooking. Local librarians have experience in giving one-on-one training and conducting small training sessions for patrons, using knowledge gained in ODL training sessions.

The ODL’s “Computer Lab Training” courses for librarians were recognized as “Exemplary” by the federal Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). 54 classes were held for 442 attendees. Topics included Survey Monkey, Mastering Web Search Engines, and Microsoft Movie Maker. According to the IMLS, the Computer Lab Training project was “Exemplary” because it “provided a method for the librarians of Oklahoma to acquire necessary knowledge and skills for administration, promotion and marketing of the library and its services, and to assist patrons as they use the library computers.” The ODL and Oklahoma’s local librarians would work together to make classes beneficial for both librarians and users.



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Involvement of Community Partners: Upgraded broadband connections and equipment enable local libraries to more effectively host other community groups' training sessions. Libraries equipped with room-based videoconferencing systems will become county-wide hubs for certification training. These locations will act as conduits for health and other certifications. The Library of Medicine from Houston, TX has taught grant writing classes using local OK library facilities. The Library of Medicine project was funded with LSTA money and was cited as an "Exemplary" project based on its outputs and participants' pre- and post-class evaluations.

Community partners have expressed their interest in using videoconferencing for training purposes. Joel A. Hart, President of the Integris Baptist Regional Health Center wrote that "with videoconferencing equipment available in rural areas such as ours, diabetes education and other health-related classes could be offered to the public in locations across the state where they might not otherwise be available. The enhanced access to preventative and wellness information would be extremely beneficial in addressing the serious health issues that Oklahomans face."

A Chickasaw Reg. Lib. Sys. librarian says: "We collaborated with the faculty of the Byrd Library, OU Health Sciences Center to present workshops for information available on PubMed and Medline databases. Personnel from regional nonprofit organizations were invited. Past programs include one on Diabetes and another on Nutrition which were co-sponsored by Mercy Memorial Hosp. and the OSU Extension Service."

E-Rate: The Gates Foundation has generously committed \$126,480 for the ODL to contract a specialist consulting firm to train local librarians in the E-Rate application process. This training will help ensure the sustainability of the upgrades funded by BTOP.

Sustainability:

Federal and State E-Rate are the primary and most critical sources to sustain the project after the grant period expires. The project would be unsustainable for most libraries without E-Rate funds. Libraries selected are aware of the potential for cost increases and have signed letters of commitment. Those incapable of supporting the potential cost increases have not been included. The main recurring costs in the budget that require sustainability are the monthly Internet charges.

Federal E-Rate: OK has a strong history of USF (E-Rate) participation with 96% of the libraries successfully participating in the E-Rate program. The average E-Rate discount on monthly Internet charges in OK is 80%. Libraries will continue to apply for E-Rate with the help of E-Rate support from a national trainer. E-Rate is expected to sustain the vast majority of the monthly Internet charges starting in July 2011 when new connections are turned on and continue well after the period of the grant.

State E-Rate: In addition to Federal E-Rate, State E-Rate provides up to \$246 per location per month for Internet charges and further helps in making the monthly costs going forward affordable. State E-Rate will contribute starting July 2011, in line with the Federal E-Rate schedule.
