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Project Indicators (This Quarter)

1. Please describe significant project accomplishments completed during this quarter (600 words or less).

During 2011 Q1 the following activities were initiated for the California Telehealth Network eHealth Broadband Adoption project.

Access to Broadband Network: The California Telehealth Network (CTN) is a high-priority, visible initiative that will bring broadband to underserved regions in the state. CTN site membership enrollment continues to grow. At the end of Q4 2010, a total of 127 CTN site membership agreements were in place. (A total of 177 agreements were erroneously reported in the report for Q4 2010.) Our Q1 2011 total has grown to 138 sites; 70 of these sites are in the process of being installed and activated; while activation for 24 sites has been completed.

Comprehensive eHealth Training: The comprehensive training partnership is an innovative collaboration between academia, community-based educators, instructional design experts and tribal representatives. Curriculum will be developed for 60 hours of eHealth related online course content. During Q1 of 2011, 18 hours of course content was developed by subject matter experts for lessons addressing telehealth, clinical and consumer informatics, electronic health records and health information exchange. Production, including audio recording and integrating course content into the online course delivery structure, continues as content becomes available. The "go-live" target date for the online eHealth course curriculum is August 2011.

Model eHealth Communities: The eHealth Broadband Adoption Project will establish Model eHealth Communities (MCs) to demonstrate successful transitions to technology-enabled health delivery. A request for applications was released on March 14 of this quarter to identify collaborative partnerships interested in participating as MCs. Two live webinars were conducted providing interested applicants with information regarding the Model Community opportunity and application process. A total of 160 sites participated in the webinars. Thirty-nine Letters of Interest were received. The scoring and review process was competed in March, 2011, and was validated by an outside committee of representatives from state and non-governmental organizations. From this process, 22 sites were initially identified for due diligence. Due diligence site visits will be conducted next guarter; 15 Model eHealth Communities will be selected.

3. Please describe any challenges or issues faced during this past quarter in achieving planned progress against the project milestones listed above. In particular, please identify any areas or issues where technical assistance from the BTOP program may be useful (600 words or less).

Operational issues faced this last quarter include delays in hiring and delays in executing sub-agreements with project partners. (All but one of these were addressed by the end of the quarter.) Although these delays effect the percent completion factor for this quarter's milestones (based on project expenditures), project activities are on track with the project completion timeline.

While the majority of the delays tend to be administrative in nature, the most significant delay involved the subaward to the 501-C3 California Telehealth Network (CTN). This delay is intentional, based on the project teams' due diligence which indicated that the 501-C3 CTN organization is not yet ready to receive funds or hire staff. The issues that have resulted in this delay are being addressed in the next month; some activities initially included in the subaward scope of work are being conducted by University staff while the 501AWARD NUMBER: 06-43-B10584

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C3 addresses these challenges.

Some subject matter experts for the online eHealth training component are behind schedule in submitting lesson content. We are compensating for these delays in two ways: 1) making faster progress on those lessons that have been submitted, and 2) remaining flexible with respect to the order of production.

Clear communication continues to be a key factor for managing time constraints and conflicting demands and priorities. The internal UC Davis BTOP SBA management team meets on a weekly basis to discuss the status of activities and to troubleshoot/ problem solve those areas that may need specific attention. Meetings with the partners involved in the development of the online educational curriculum are held on a monthly basis to discuss course content, review progress for the online course design and address any areas of possible content overlap. The Grant Manager also meets biweekly with the online system production team to identify and resolve issues that could result in potential delays.

Funding from the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) will allow us to enroll 863 Community Anchor healthcare sites to the California Telehealth Network (CTN) for medical grade, secure access. Of these, 575 will be medical and healthcare providers, 262 will be public safety entities, and 26 will be institutions of higher education. In addition to these healthcare sites, 55 community colleges and 480 libraries will be involved with the eHealth Training component.

The targeted number of new subscribers noted in the baseline plan for this quarter was 50. As of March 2011, a total of 127 CTN site membership agreements were in place. (A total of 177 agreements were erroneously reported in the report for Q4 2010.) Our Q1 2011 total has grown to 138 sites; 70 of these sites are in the process of being installed and activated; while activation for 24 sites has been completed.

Please describe significant project accomplishments planned for completion during the next quarter (600 words or less).

Access to Broadband Network -- The CTN expects to have a total of 84 sites connected by the end of June 2011 with broadband managed router services. Site recruitment continues including briefing sessions targeting healthcare providers interested in participating in proposed model community projects.

Comprehensive eHealth Adoption Training: Production activities for all seven of the online eHealth course modules will intensify next quarter, with most remaining content due in April/May/June. Upon completion of the course content development and audio recording, these lessons will be posted on the development server. This phase of the development/ design process will allow content experts and the UCD BTOP team to view course content as it will appear in the online environment prior to going "live".

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Model eHealth Communities: Due diligence site visits will be conducted with the 22 Model eHealth Community finalists in April and May of Quarter 2, 2011. The site visits will provide an opportunity for applicants to discuss in greater detail their vision and goals for the model community and to explore in more depth the use of broadband dependant health care applications to advance technology enabled health care in their community. Site visits for these 22 communities will be completed in May, and the final 15 Model eHealth Communities will be identified and notified in June 2011.

The transition of the CTN to an independent 501-c3 organization is an unexpected challenge. Full staffing of the CTN will be delayed until this transition is final.
