

NJSL Grant Procedure for Subrecipients

The New Jersey State Library (NJSL) has been a fiscal agent for federal grants to New Jersey libraries since the first library aid program began in 1956. That program, entitled the Library Services Act (LSA), was designed primarily to support rural libraries. When it was extended in 1964 it was renamed the Library Services and Construction Act (LSCA), due to its new focus on funding construction as well as library services. The current program, the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA), has been in existence since 1996, when the focus changed from construction to technology support for libraries.

In checking the most readily available historical grant records, during the time period July 1, 1970 to June 30, 1971, the State Library was responsible for allocating \$1,376,271 in LSCA funds to New Jersey libraries for the purposes of library services, construction, interlibrary cooperation, service to the institutionalized and service to the blind and handicapped.

For the most recently completed federal grant year of 2008, which ended September 30, 2009, the State Library was responsible for allocating \$4,343,636 in LSTA funds to support library services throughout the state. In accordance with current LSTA purposes, these funds were used to support literacy and diversity projects, statewide interlibrary loan, electronic resources and technology infrastructure, as well as the statewide Talking Book and Braille Center. The State Library's current LSTA grant for federal grant year 2009 is \$4,530,049.

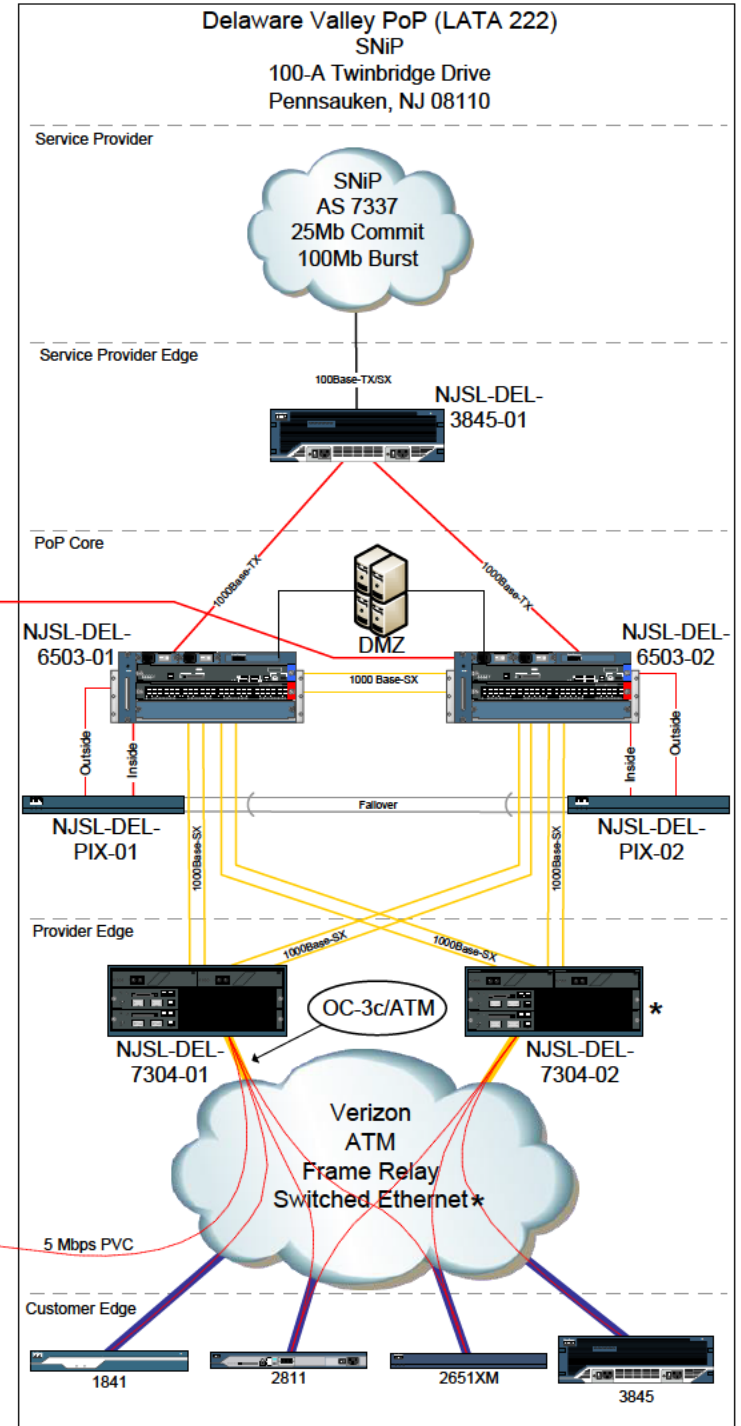
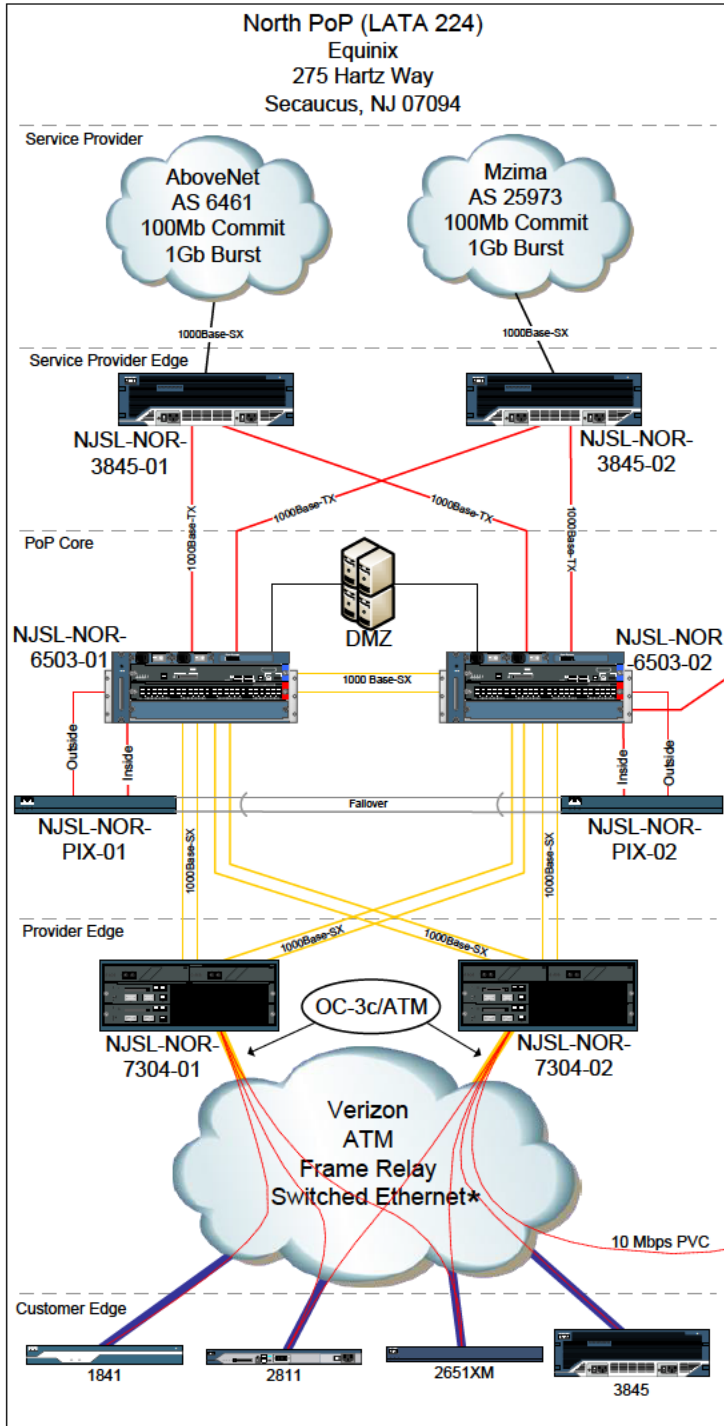
The State Library, as part of Thomas Edison State College (TESC), is subject to annual external audits by KPMG LLP. The auditors perform the financial statement audit under generally accepted auditing standards and review internal controls in accordance with Government Auditing Standards. In addition, TESC and the State Library are audited for compliance with the requirements of the Federal OMB Circular A-133, *Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations* as well as New Jersey OMB Circular 04-04, *Single Audit Policy for Recipients of Federal Grants, State Grants and State Aid*. The federal LSTA grant is considered a major program at both the federal and state level and as such is subject to additional annual testing to ensure compliance with the requirements of both A-133 and 04-04 circulars. The auditors have cited no areas of non-compliance with regards to the management and disbursement of federal LSTA funds.

Sub-recipient monitoring is required by *OMB Circular A-133*, for all payments made to subrecipients. A vendor is not required to be monitored by the pass-through entity, per A-133. A sub-recipient is defined as "a non-Federal entity to carry out a Federal program, but does not include an individual that is a beneficiary of such a program. A sub-recipient may also be a recipient of other Federal awards directly from a Federal awarding agency."

Grants and Aids Management Procedures (GAMP) is a policy and procedures manual maintained by the New Jersey State Library. This policy and procedures manual details the procedures that are followed by the State Library and their subrecipients in managing various grants. Included below is a brief outline of grant procedures and sub-recipient monitoring.

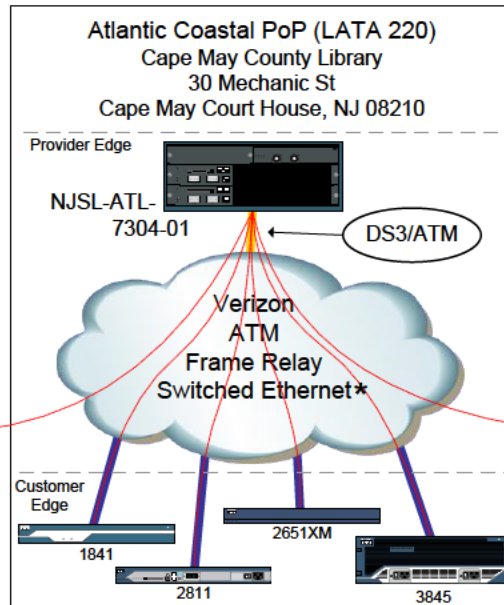
- A request for proposal is written and distributed to all eligible libraries specifically stating the purpose of the grant and the allowability of expenditures. Grants may be competitive, non-competitive or targeted to specific libraries. The various potential grant recipients prepare and submit grant proposals stating how funds will be spent to meet the purpose of the grant.

- The proposals are reviewed for allowability by the Program Manager or designees and awards are made. An award letter is sent to the various recipients informing them of the grant.
- Grant recipients receive and must sign a copy of the contract prepared by the State Library. The contract specifies the grant award number, the start/end dates of the grant, the purpose of the grant, the payment and reporting schedules, and additional provisions.
- Each grant requires, at a minimum, a mid-year progress report and a final progress and expenditure report. Budget modifications of plus/minus 10% in any budget category must be submitted in writing and must be approved by the Director of Library Development Bureau (LDB) and the Chief Financial Officer (CFO).
- Payments are generally made on a planned schedule with the first payment made soon after the signed contract is received back from the sub-recipient. Ten percent of each grant award is held back and is not disbursed until State Library approval of the final program and expenditure reports.
- Grants are tracked in the Business Office using MicroEdge's *GIFTS* grants management software. All deliverables and payment dates are entered into *GIFTS* along with contract numbers, funding sources and grantee contact information. Each week a report is generating detailing which payments are due to subrecipients so that payments are made in a timely manner. Payments that are contingent on a specific deliverable (ie, progress report submission) are held until deliverables are received and approved by the Director of LDB and or the CFO.
- When all funds are expended or the grant activities per the proposal are complete, the sub-recipient completes an expenditure report detailing the grant-related expenditures. The expenditure report along with the applicable support (copies of invoices, payment vouchers, etc.) and a narrative of how funds were expended are submitted to the State Library.
- The expenditure reports are reviewed for allowability of costs and compared with the original proposal to ensure the expenditures are consistent with the proposal. Upon approval of expenditure reports, the remaining 10% reserve, or portion of, is distributed to the subrecipients. If the sub-recipient spent less in total than the amount of funds advanced to the sub-recipient, a letter is sent by the CFO requesting reimbursement of the excess funds.
- A single audit is required for all subrecipients with grant expenditures exceeding \$500,000 (\$300,000 for State of NJ funds). The single audit report and corrective action plan for all findings is submitted to the State Library.
- The single audit report is reviewed to ensure it is complete and a written evaluation is prepared regarding any findings and corrective action plans set forth by the sub-recipient. The State Library follows up with the subrecipient to ensure corrective action plans are implemented as specified. The audit report is also reviewed by the Department of Community Affairs to ensure compliance with New Jersey Municipality reporting requirements.



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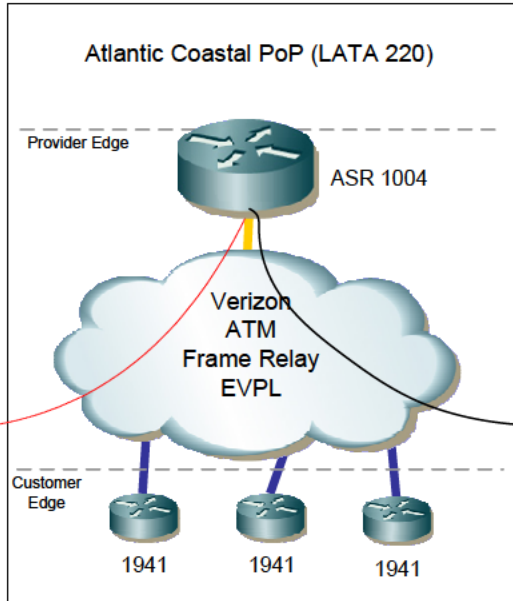
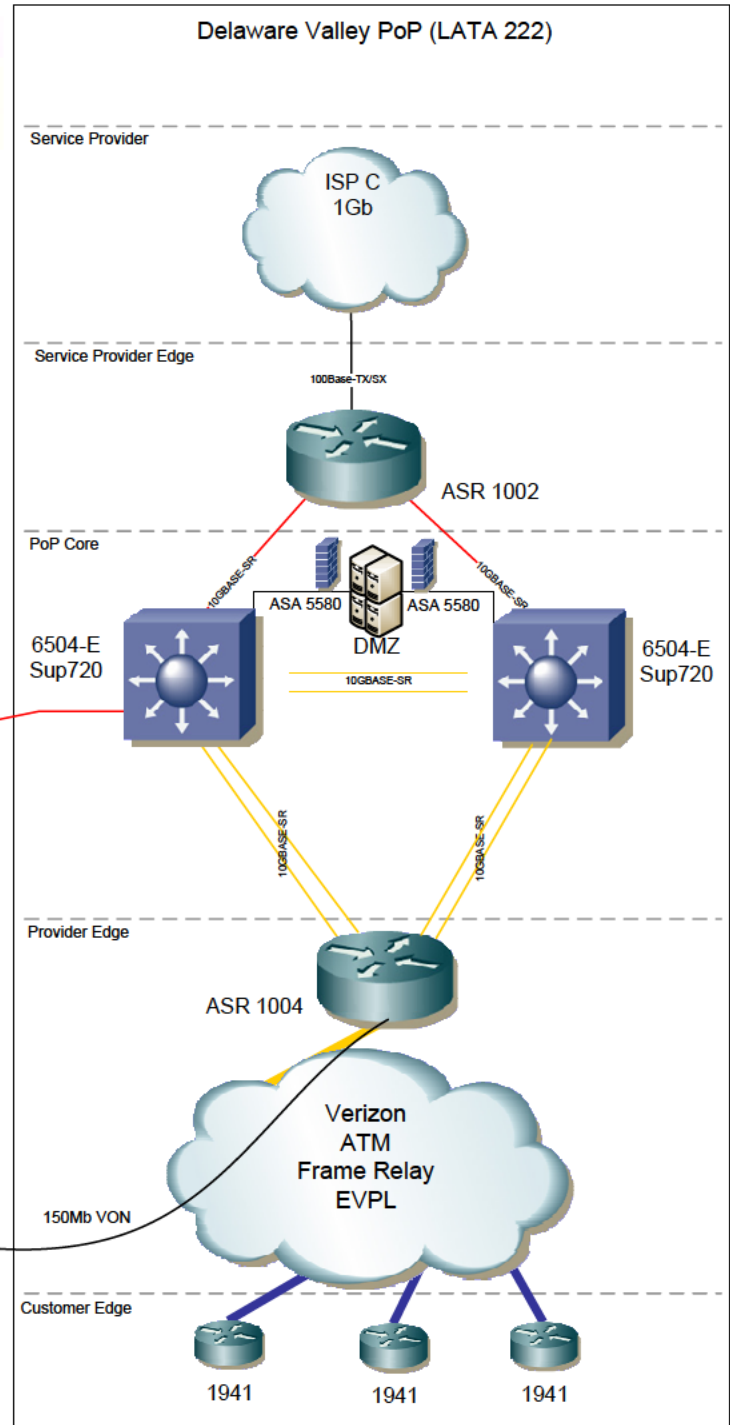
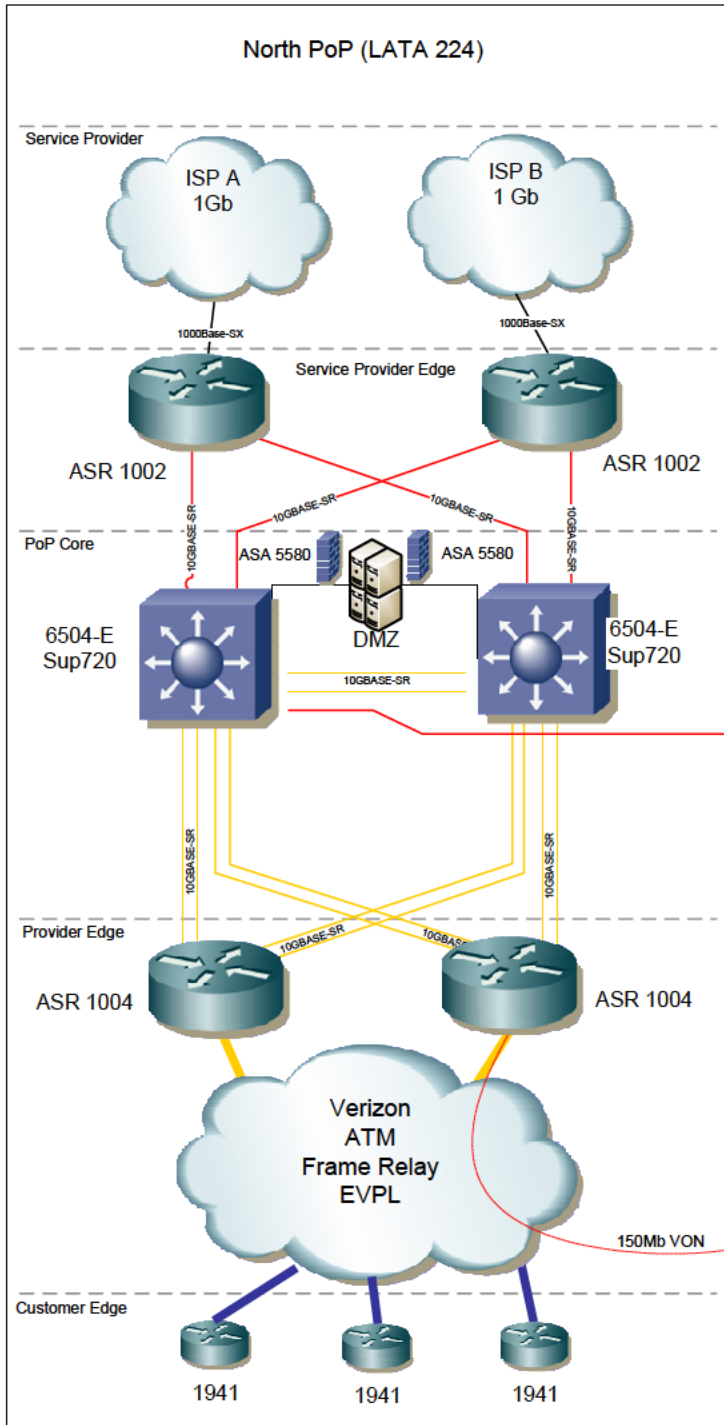
Current Network Design

The Technology Services help desk provides a single point of contact through which customers may report faults and deviance from their normal service, in addition to any other communication related to technology services provided through JerseyConnect. 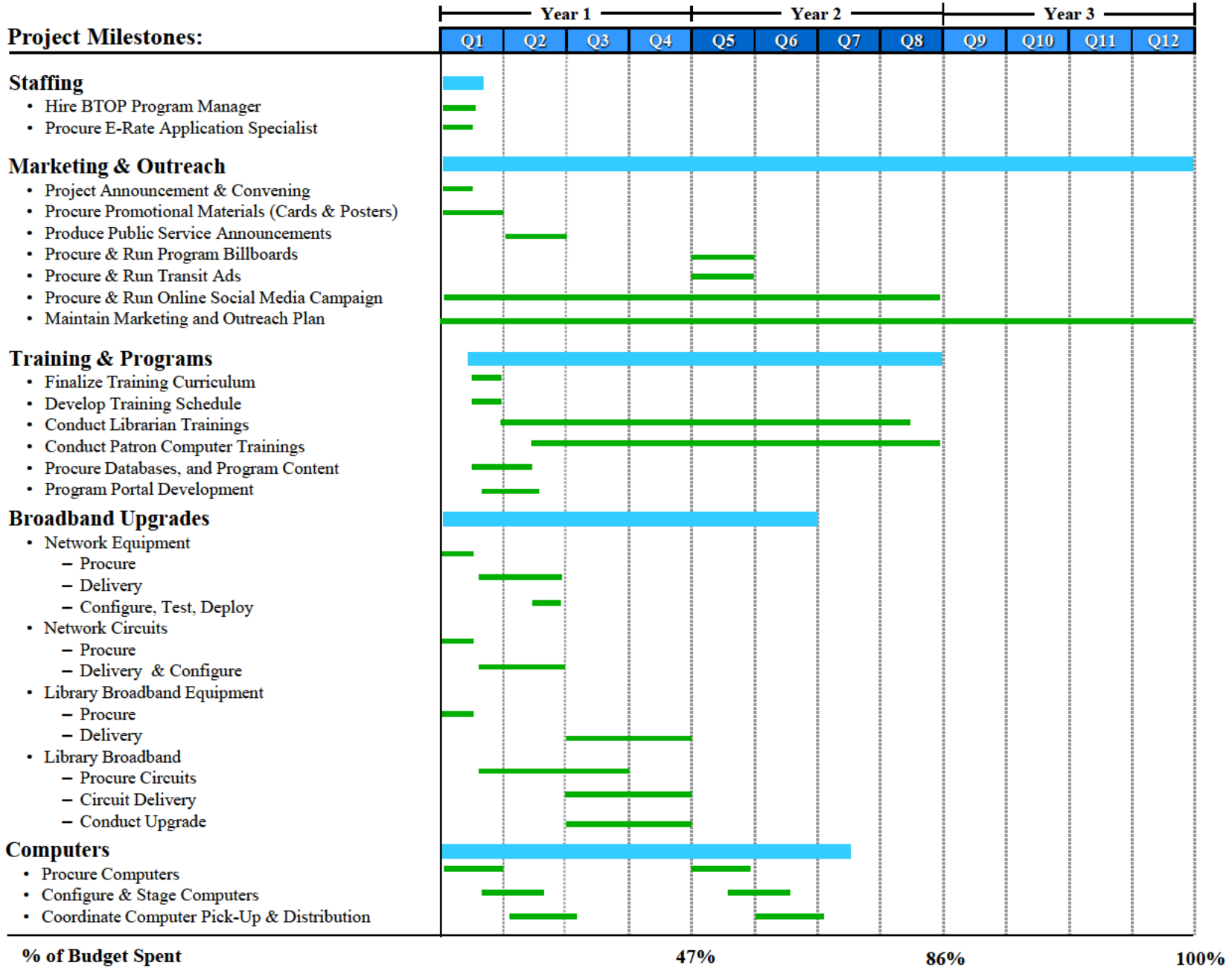

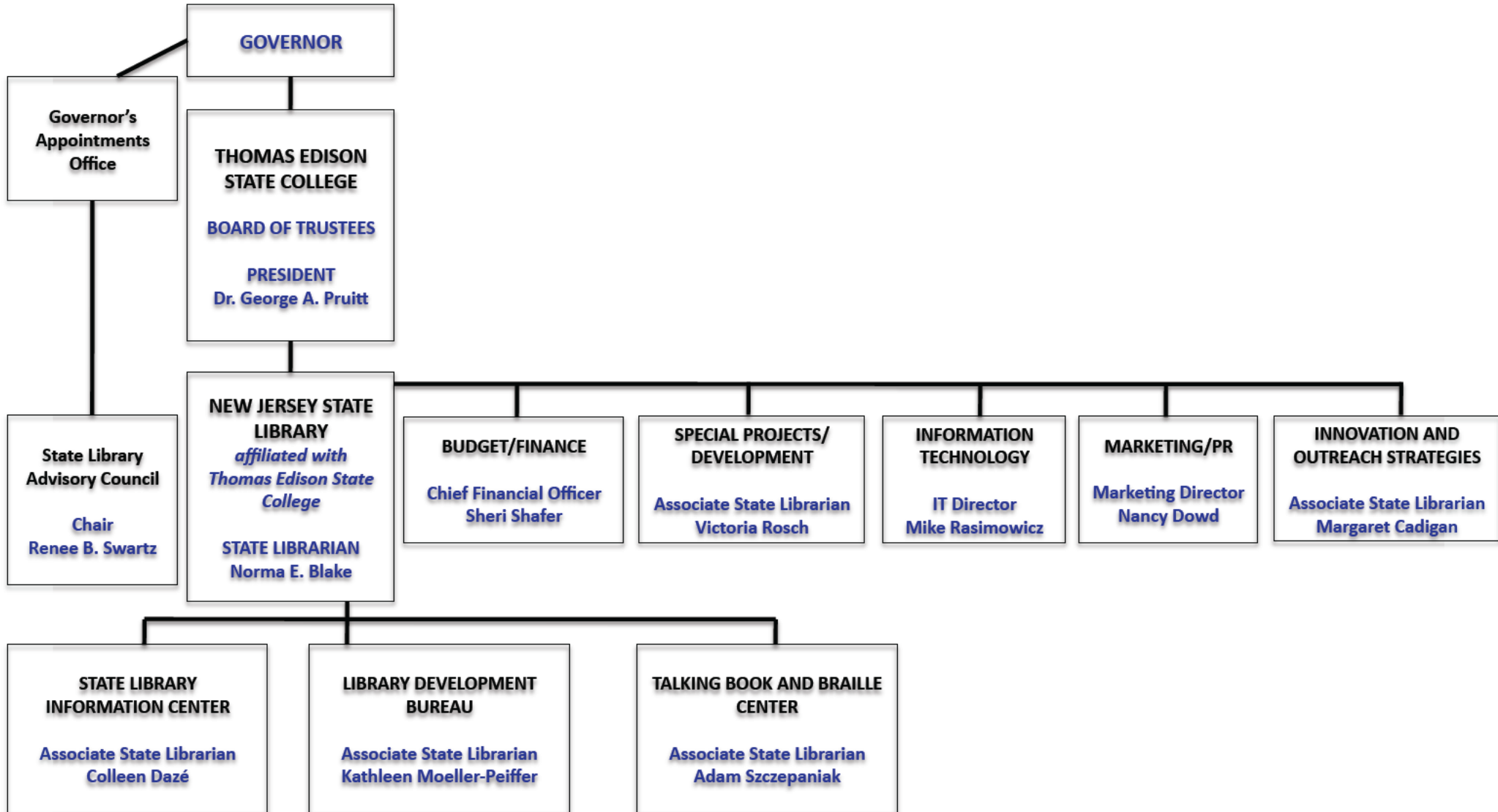

New Jersey State Library, Trenton, NJ – 2001-Present

Norma E. Blake has been New Jersey State Librarian since February 20, 2001. During her tenure, she has guided New Jersey libraries toward proactive collaborations that created working partnerships and relationships with a variety of educational and corporate institutions. She has also forged relationships with the state's economic development and commercial players from small businesses to the huge biotech industry. She has led libraries toward the future through the development of innovative programs that serve as national models and by convening conferences to help libraries prepare for their future roles. Under her leadership the State Library supports everyone in New Jersey with a new kind of library service that addresses time and technology through 24/7 online reference service centers and databases that provide essential information when and where people need it. Her vision propels libraries forward and challenges them to create the programs, products and services that will meet the needs of everyone in their communities. Norma is a frequent guest speaker on library topics and has presented internationally as well as nationally.

Awards

Norma was selected as *Library Journal's* Librarian of the Year 2008, Girl Scouts of South-Central New Jersey's Women of Distinction Award 2008, New Jersey Library Association's Librarian of the Year, elected President of the New Jersey Library Association (NJLA), chosen as a member of Leadership NJ Class of 2000 and recipient of the Distinguished Service Award 2005, by the NJLA's Colleges and Universities Section. Burlington County League of Women Voters honored as a 2010 Burlington County woman who makes a difference.

Innovative Projects Spearheaded by Norma E. Blake

- **The New Jersey Knowledge Initiative** (NJKI) won the Innovation Award from the National Council of State Governments for helping New Jersey's economy by providing specialized databases for small businesses, researchers, students and teachers. In two years NJKI had 15 million downloads and saved New Jersey taxpayers \$68.5 million dollars over retail prices.
- **QandANJ**, the nation's first virtual 24/7 information system, providing New Jersey residents who need information with access to live librarians. The Web site, www.qandanj.org, is on the Governor's Web page.
- **Super Librarian**, New Jersey's first statewide marketing campaign, designed to promote the use of libraries by teens. It received national attention and was featured in over 2,000 commercials, produced a comic book written in two languages, developed an online store and created a YouTube/comic contest that attracted over 17,000 voters.
- **JerseyCat**, a highly successful interlibrary loan system, connecting people to the collections of over 800 libraries. Last year 15 million searches were made statewide.
- **JerseyClicks**, New Jersey's first Web portal, providing access to 27 statewide online resources with the ease of one-click searching much like Google.
- **Trustee Training Institutes**. implemented to provide annual meetings, training over 800 Library Trustees since the Institutes began four years ago.
- **Statewide Summer Reading Club**, expanded to a statewide initiative, keeping children and teens reading throughout their vacation. Last year 127,000 children and teens read 1.5 million books.
- **JerseyConnect**, provided over 300 New Jersey libraries an economical solution to Internet access and services, delivered through the services of the State Library's IT Department.

- **Innovative programming for the Blind, Deaf and Hard of Hearing** such as American Sign Language storytimes, specialized summer reading programs and Audiovision radio reading service for the blind providing news 24/7 on the Web.
- **MidAtlantic Futures Conference**, the first of its kind for New Jersey libraries, with over 400 librarians from four states attending. Norma followed up by creating a Blue Ribbon Task Force on the Future of Libraries, 2007-2008.
- **Adaptive Computer Lab**, in partnership with the Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired, located at the Library for the Blind and Handicapped to train people with visual impairments.
- **Leadership Academy**, founded to increase the skills and abilities of middle managers and seasoned librarians, involving library leadership from all over the state.
- **InfoTubey Award**, awarded to five libraries, including the New Jersey State Library in the nation for outstanding You Tube library-related video production, garnering national attention.
- **Pennies for Peace**, which involved libraries of all types statewide in collecting pennies to build libraries in schools in Pakistan and Afghanistan. Pennies for Peace is the State Library's Lincoln Bicentennial Project to honor Lincoln for his belief in education. Pennies for Peace will expand to other state libraries all over the country utilizing the New Jersey State Library program model. The State Library successfully partnered with the Pennies for Peace Foundation to develop this pilot program based on Greg Mortenson's best selling book, *Three Cups of Tea*.
- **Snapshot Day**, which measured library use and services in one day statewide with photos and statistics collected in libraries. Snapshot Day is being adopted by the American Library Association as a national advocacy model which helps to demonstrate the value of libraries in their communities.
- **Tell Us Your Story Campaign**, where librarians learned new marketing skills in a marketing boot camp; attended a workshop by marketing guru Seth Godin, and created videos for their library; telling their library story. Awards were given for the best videos in a special Academy awards type red carpet event.
- **Celebrity Library Champions**, where famous authors and sport figures agreed to become library champions for the states' libraries. Large billboard pictures of the champions with their personal quotes about the importance of libraries and literacy were developed. The posters will also be used on the backs of trucks statewide. Trading cards of the sports figures will be made for libraries to give out to children and young adults.
- **Gates Opportunity Online Grant**, given to the NJ State Library to provide for a consultant who will work with State Library staff to apply for stimulus broad band funding for last mile connections. The Broadband Grant will complete a major connectivity goal of the State Library and benefit libraries statewide.

- IMLS federal grant for development of NJ Digital Highway that has digitized and posted over 1,000 NJ historical resources to the Web

- WebJunction grant to help libraries reach out to Spanish populations

- \$45 million library construction grant that provided funding to 68 libraries and generated \$280 million in economic development

The New Jersey State Library awards grants to public libraries for literacy and diversity training, as well as for pilot grant programs such as Libraries Trading Spaces Teen Spaces and Senior Spaces; grants awarded to renovate and improve library spaces using marketing ideas and techniques.
