The NIST Grants & Agreement Management Division (NIST) is placing the Youth Policy Institute's (YPI) grant award (Grant Award No. 06-42-B10579) on a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) as a result of the National Telecommunications and Information Administration's (NTIA) notifying NIST of YPI's material noncompliance with the terms and conditions of the award. During a site visit conducted by the NTIA on November 29-30, 2011, it was discovered that YPI is not in compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act requirements of the award. Specifically, YPI was found to be non-compliant with the following Davis-Bacon requirements:

- The inclusion of required contract provisions (appearing at 29 C.F.R. Section 5.5) in contracts or subcontracts for activities covered by the Davis-Bacon Act for internal renovations and wiring at some of the Public Computer Center (PCC) sites using BTOP funds.
- Verification that the Davis-Bacon Act prevailing wage requirements will be paid to laborers and mechanics employed under a contract or a subcontract in excess of \$2,000 for construction, alteration, or repair activities (including but not limited to, painting and decorating) that are funded, in whole or in part, using Recovery Act Funds, including BTOP grant funds.
- Proper documentation that the contractors and subcontractors prepare and submit weekly certified payroll using Form WH-347 for laborers and mechanics performing activities covered by the Davis-Bacon Act requirements.
- Ensuring the DOL Davis-Bacon poster (WH-1321) is prominently posted at the sites of the work.

Special Award Condition:

19. Corrective Action Plan (CAP)

In order to ensure compliance with Davis-Bacon Act requirements, the NIST is placing YPI on a Corrective Action Plan (CAP), pursuant to 15 C.F.R. § 14.14. In order to prevent the possibility of additional enforcement action being taken, YPI must submit to the NIST Grants & Agreement Management Division a CAP response and timeline for complying with Davis-Bacon requirements by June 4, 2012. The plan should include the following:

- copies of all contracts and sub-contracts to verify that provisions appearing at 29 C.F.R. Part 5.5 are inserted in full in any contract for activities covered by the Davis-Bacon Act and related acts including construction, alteration and/or repair, including painting and decorating of public buildings or public works.
- a statement certifying:
 - 1) Contractors have been and will be paid at the prevailing wage rates for YPI's locality as determined by the Department of Labor (DoL).
 - 2) YPI's contractors and subcontractors are preparing and submitting weekly certified payroll documentation using Form WH-347 (www.dol.gov/whd/forms/wh347.pdf) for laborers and mechanics performing activities covered by the Davis-Bacon Act requirements.
 - 3) Visual inspection of the DoL Davis-Bacon poster (WH-1321) to ensure it is prominently posted at the sites of the work. See www.dol.gov/whd/regs/compliance/posters/fedprojc.pdf.
