Tribal Digital Village Broadband Adoption Program -

For our Broadband adoption program we plan to increase broadband adoption from the 17% current baseline usage to 70% (4800 new broadband users) among members of 19 Native American tribes in rural So. California. This will be accomplished through outreach & public awareness, digital literacy training, content creation, and establishment of sustainable business models.

First quarter activities focused on communication with the subrecipient partner and general project administration including:

- Communicated with subrecipient partner regarding project parameters. Utilized electronic and verbal
 communication to provide detailed information to subrecipient partner and answer any inquiries. This included
 verification that the subrecipient had obtained DUNS number and had updated their profile in the Dun and
 Bradstreet website. Work on standardized subaward agreement for subrecipient commenced.
- <u>Completed the federal requirements for registering our program.</u> With assistance from our program officer and grants specialist, established reporting mechanisms for American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) via Federal Reporting.gov and Post-Award Monitoring (PAM) System.
